

ADVENT WREATH: Third Sunday of Advent (Theme: "Celebration")

Today, during our candle lighting liturgy, the purple candles previously lit over the past two weeks will again be lit - plus the pink candle set down for lighting today. These candles have different meanings and are lit in the following order: purple, purple, pink, purple, white. The first is called the "Candle of Hope". It symbolizes our faith in God keeping His promises to humanity. The second is called the "Candle of Preparation", reminding Christians to get ready to receive God. The third candle is the "Candle of Joy". It recalls the angels joyfully singing about the birth of Christ. The fourth candle, the "Candle of Love", reminds Christians that God loves them enough to send his only Son to Earth. The "Christ Candle", the white candle in the centre, stands for Jesus Christ himself and is lit for the actual Christmas celebrations.

GAUDETE SUNDAY: Today is Gaudete Sunday. "Gaudete" is from the Latin and means "rejoice". For those who have Advent Wreaths, this is the day when the pink candle is lit to emphasise the change in direction that now takes place in our preparation for Christmas. From this Sunday, we focus more on Mary. soon to be Jesus' mother, as may be seen from our scripture readings.

Week 3: Lighting of the two purple candles and the pink candle: From Isaiah we read, "The people who walk in darkness have seen a great light." God of Blessings, we celebrate your good gifts and rejoice in the gift of your Son, Jesus. As the candle is lit, we all say:

"Let this candle remind us that Iesus is comina and in Him we rejoice".
