

Logo therapy is the art of healing by giving hope and meaning to one's sufferings. Viktor Frankl, an Austrian neurologist, psychiatrist and author of many books, had discovered this method to treat his psychologically affected patients. It is a method of psycho-therapy evolved around giving hope and meaning to one's life. Our world seems to be trapped in a cycle of hopelessness threatening to destroy our capacity to imagine and wonder. How many of us ever spend time to imagine what it would be like if the whole world lives at peace? We do not look at the possibilities of peace, so invent reason to miss-trust and fight with one another. We invent weapons and words to keep away one another. It is because we do not really believe in the power of God's word. Yet we hear in the first reading the "Prophet Isaiah saying, "The word that goes from my mouth does not return empty" (Isaiah 55:11). Jesus himself being the Word of God sowed his words as seeds of life on earth, enabling the humanity to return to God with all creation. Through the power of the Word Jesus is active and alive in our midst. Like the sower in the parable God scatters the signs of his presence throughout his creation. He speaks to us in the quietness of our hearts. Do we meet the Lord of Peace? Are we able to silence many noises of war within us that destroy our capacity to allow God's voice to be heard? We can hear God's life-giving word in any of our life's experiences. We can hear God's words in pleasant and great events and experiences. But we could also hear God's word, and often more clearly, in unpleasant aspects of our lives if we are sensitive to creation. St. Paul says "Creation groaning in a great act of giving birth" (Romans 8:22). It means God can speak to us powerfully through our pains, problems, our weakness, fears and ambiguities of life. It is not enough to hear or just listen to the word of God. Like the sower's seeds in the parable, it must germinate in our hearts and they should become seeds of life. We must practice them. The word must bear fruit in our lives. Our effort in putting God's word into practice may be small like a seed but if we allow it everyday to grow in us, we may be able to see the miracles of growth happening all around us. Thus let us open our hearts and make it a fertile ground, so that the seed of God's words may grow well and we may produce hundredfold.

PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE: We have begun work on our Parish Plan for the coming twelve months or so. We are considering the development of the Parish Plan under three of the main themes from Plenary 2020:

- 1. Being a Jesus-inspired, humble, healing and merciful parish community
- 2. Being a missionary and evangelising parish community
- 3. Being a joyful and hope-filled parish community

This will involve drawing on our Plenary Council 2020 submissions and the associated documents and papers. We will involve parishioners in the process as we move along.

PARISH COUNCIL TO MEET WITH MINISTRY GROUPS: After mass on Sunday 26th July, the Parish Council members and Fr Jolly would like to meet with one or two members of each ministry group in the parish hall. The contact person and one other person are being invited to this meeting. We would love to have the whole group there, but we need to bare in mind the numbers. The purpose of the meeting will be to touch base and hear how groups are going, any particular needs at this time and what might be coming up for the remainder of the year. We will also talk about the new sacramental ministries group/s for preparation of those wanting to receive the sacraments and for those interested in leading communion services.

ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER SUNDAY ~

In the wake of the death of George Floyd and the worldwide Black Lives Matter protests, Fr Frank Brennan SJ says a spotlight is shining on "the appalling statistics of Aboriginal deaths in custody" in Australia. Source: Crux.

Fr Brennan, who received the Order of Australia for his work for Aboriginal rights, was speaking during a Mass for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday, observed on July 5. In his homily, Fr Brennan referred to the 2017 Uluru Statement from the Heart, where Indigenous representatives told the Australia people that their "sovereignty is a spiritual notion: the ancestral tie between the land, or 'mother nature', and the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples who were born therefrom, remain attached thereto, and must one day return thither to be united with our ancestors. This link is the basis of the ownership of the soil, or better, of sovereignty." The Jesuit said he hoped the statement would "change hearts, providing a more secure place for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples in the life of the Australian nation."

Fr Brennan noted that the preparatory documents for the upcoming Australian Catholic plenary council has called for forging deeper relationships with Australia's indigenous peoples.

"This Discernment Group has laid down the challenge: The Church in Australia must be shaped by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture and spirituality for it to be authentically a Church of this land. When the Church sinks its roots deep into Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture, it will authentically be a Church in the land with a new vision and energy for mission," he said
