POPE'S JUBILEE OF THE SOCIALLY EXCLUDED: As was the case last week, Pope Francis has decreed that this weekend will commemorate the Jubilee of the Socially Excluded, within the framework of this year's Extraordinary Year of Mercy. The Pope explained, and I quote his words: "That is, those who for different reasons - from economic precariousness to various illnesses, from loneliness to the lack of family bonds - have difficulty in inserting themselves in the social fabric and often remain at the margins of society, without a home or a place to live."

In Rome, about six thousand participants from a number of European countries are expected to participate in an intense Jubilee programme involving many of Rome's churches in which Pope Francis will be actively involved. Archbishop Rino Fisichello, president of the Pontifical Council for Promoting New Evangelization, reminded us that "On Sunday, as you know, the Holy Door will be closed in all the churches and shrines in the world." He added: "The Jubilee celebration in St. Peter's intended to remind the Church of Jesus' words: 'The poor you will always have with you.' The closing of the Door of Mercy, therefore, does not mark the end of the Church's commitment, but rather in the light of the Jubilee we have experienced, reinforces her witness."

The closing of the Holy Door in St. Patrick's Cathedral, Parramatta is to take place this afternoon, 13th November, from 4.30pm-7.00pm in keeping with Rome's instructions. Dinner will be available for purchase should you be interested in attending this unique event!
