# Happy Easter Everyone! Alleluía! Alleluía!

A day to celebrate! Renewed! Revitalized! Refreshed! Perhaps even a little lighter from our Lenten diet. However, that has been more than offset by the extra support we have both given to those in need, and received from the many who have been so generous to us during this time. So it has been like that for the past forty days.

We have given much during Lent for our own spiritual benefit – a benefit that has also aided many other people. May you experience the fullness of Jesus' personal love for you, also the peace and happiness which he brings into your life, and the lives of your family and those precious to you on this greatest of all Christ's feasts. We have emerged from our Lenten sacrifices to the new dawn of our Christian life enjoyed in our commemoration today of his Resurrection. I also take this opportunity to thank, on behalf of myself and all parishioners, the many families and individuals who have made this year's Lent and Easter so special for us through their extra planning and conduct of our Masses and liturgies.

**AFTER EASTER:** I repeat last week's Bulletin message in which I stated that the first Mass to be celebrated after Easter Sunday will be the 9.00am Mass on Friday, 21st April, when I will once again be in residence. Again, I apologise for any inconvenience this may cause anyone!

**DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY** (23rd April): Next Sunday is that very special Feast of Divine Mercy, proclaimed for us by Pope St John Paul II at the canonization of Saint Faustina Kowalski on 30th April 2000. In his proclamation, Pope St John Paul said "...It is important then that we accept the whole message that comes to us from the Word of God on this 2nd Sunday of Easter which, from now on throughout the Church, will be called Divine Mercy Sunday." The readings on that Sunday are all about mercy, trust and the forgiveness of sins. Locally, on that day, special celebrations are to be held at St Bonaventure's Church, Leura from 2.45pm. So, spread the word among your friends!

ANZAC DAY: Tuesday week, 25th April, is ANZAC DAY. Our normal 6.30pm Mass will NOT be celebrated on that day. However, a special, suitably themed Mass will be held at 9.00am here at Blackheath, leaving us enough time to adjourn to the Blackheath War Memorial for the start of their main ceremony from 10.45am. We will be laying a wreath at the War Memorial during that Remembrance Service on behalf of all parishioners. Lest we forget!
