CORPUS CHRISTI: Now more appropriately known as “The Body and Blood of Christ” - a title change that was made in 1970 following the conclusion of the Second Vatican Council in 1965 - this Solemnity Feast of the then “Corpus Christi” (Latin for “Body of Christ”), was expanded to include the “Blood of Christ” that has always been the centrepiece of our Mass - the Eucharist! This Solemnity emerged in the 13th century at a time when people rarely received Holy Communion. The Church brought in a law decreeing that people receive the Eucharist at least once a year during the Easter Season, while daily Communion only became available to us after WW1. These days we Catholics consider the Eucharist to be the ‘source and summit’ of the Church’s life throughout the year. Today, especially, we once more pause to consider the way we are nourished by the “Body of Christ” and the “Blood of Christ”. We receive this perfect gift from, and of, Christ Himself within the community of faith; it is a call to unity. So, let us be ever conscious of Christ’s personal presence in the gifts of His Body and Blood to us through His Eucharist.

OUR PATRONAL FEAST: Friday next (23rd June) is the Solemnity Feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. Mass will commence at the normal starting time of 9.00am. However, to bring added honour to this Feast, we will also share a Holy Hour that day after Mass has concluded. Exposition of the Most Blessed Sacrament will then occur, plus recitation of the Litany of the Most Sacred Heart. A short period of quiet reflection will then follow with Benediction to conclude the hour. This is a very special Feast for us, given the singular patronage we, as a parish, enjoy through Jesus’ Most Sacred Heart. All welcome! We will also be celebrating this special Feast at the 9.30am Mass next Sunday, 25th June.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNICANTS: This morning, six young parishioners are to make their First Holy Communion - **Angela Kate COLLINS, Alicia Deanne MALAFANT, Dylan Victor REZZONICO, Sophia Isabella Grace SHEERE, Eliza Paris WENTZEL and Logan WENTZEL.** Our Sacramental Co-ordinator, Jennifer Milani, has prepared these young people for this huge day in their lives when each will join the rest of us in full communion with our Beloved Saviour, Jesus Christ. Jennifer has guided these children on their learning journey through the scriptures that involved for them the discovery of our faith - what it means to be a Catholic - and what it really means to be a part of our Eucharistic “family”. However, as with most things in life, Jennifer had much support and involvement from parents and others who also contributed to today’s achievements by our first communicants. Congratulations, everyone, especially Jennifer, the children, parents and staff for making this such a special day for the entire parish! ***Please refrain from taking photographs during the Mass.*** Afterwards, we will gather in the hall for the special cake and photo time!
