Social Justice Sunday and visit of **Bishop Vincent Long** 25 September As announced in



recent weeks our Parish, the western most and smallest in the Parramatta Diocese, has been invited to host the Diocesan launch of the Australian Catholic Bishops' Social Statement for 2016/2017. On Wednesday this week. Fr Bob received the wonderful news that Bishop Vincent, in his capacity as Chairman of the Australian Catholic Social Justice Council, will be coming to Blackheath for the launch. And, of course, he will be visiting us for the first time as our new Bishop!

The theme of this year's Social Justice Statement is "A Place at the Table: Social Justice in an Ageing Society". The Statement celebrates the value and dignity of older people in Australian life.

It challenges us to recognise their significant contribution to society and emphasises that this contribution should not be valued in mere economic terms. The Statement calls for justice for those who are most vulnerable and warns about a view of older people as burdensome or dispensable. Given the demographics of our little Community and indeed, much of the Upper Blue Mountains, it is most apt that we act as host for this launch!

After our Mass we will adjourn to the Parish Hall for the launch of the Social Justice Statement and a workshop exploring its contents - hosted by Sister Louise McKeogh and representatives of CatholicCare Blacktown Neighbourhood Centre. Our own Care Group will also be showcasing some of their involvement in our Community. We shall then have the opportunity to chat with Bishop Vincent as we enjoy a light lunch together.
