
It's easy to avoid the person whose disability makes you uncomfortable.

GARAGE SALE: This has been our major fundraiser for 2017. I am also extremely conscious of the huge investment of time, effort and expertise committed over many, many months by a whole team of volunteers, so well organised by Marilyn, Sue and Patricia with results this year that, for me, are simply staggering! Despite the most oppressive heatwave conditions for many years that just about stifled all activity throughout the entire Upper Blue Mountains, including our garage sale, this was the same stifling heatwave that (I thought) kept so many potential buyers away, and our workers in a constant dehydrated state. While the final count is \$6,294.23. That beats our previous best-ever 'take' by more than \$500. And in those conditions! What an extraordinary achievement - almost beyond belief! So! Take a bow, everyone! Huge thanks to each of you! This was indeed a massive community event in which just about every parishioner (and others from outside our ranks!) shared the workload. Thank you, once more, for your commitment and dedication to the task at hand. Finally, the benefits accruing from the 'garage sale' are not just confined to our parish. Surplus merchandise has been distributed to, and been gratefully received by, a number of other charities who, too, will distribute those leftover goods to a much wider needy population.

DIOCESAN WORKS FUND (DWF): Today is the second week of this round of our DWF collection for those who may want to donate to the wider range of charitable works of the Parramatta Diocese, but who missed last week's collection. Mind you, should you have contributed last week, you are more than welcome to do so again - the need certainly exists! You will find the necessary envelopes in front of you in the pews. A reminder that a few of the ministries that the DWF supports include priests and religious training, Catholic Social Services, family support and youth activities. Overall, there are about 30 such groups who draw funding from the DWF, so please, help if you can. Many thanks to all who have so far provided funds for this essential work of the Church - and 'thank you' in advance also to those who make a donation today! Finally, please place the completed envelopes on the second collection plates.

LENTEN GROUPS: As you know, every year at this time a number of parishioners normally gather together in groups of about 6-8 people to meet weekly during Lent to better prepare each other in their formation for Holy Week and the Paschal Feast of Easter.
