**ADVENT:** Our present Church year ends next Saturday, 26 November. Sunday next begins the new Church year, Year A (Sundays) and Year I (weekdays). New Church years seldom have the same starting date because Advent always begins on the Sunday closest to the Feast of St Andrew which is celebrated on 30 November. This year that date falls on Wednesday week. Advent has a twofold character – as a Season to prepare for Christmas when Christ's birth is remembered; and as a Season when that remembrance directs our hearts and minds to await Christ's second coming at the end of time. Advent is, therefore, a period of joyful penance and expectation. Please note that our Christmas/New Year Mass days and times will be listed here next week.

**ADVENT WREATH:** As already stated, next Sunday is the beginning of the Season of Advent. The word 'Advent' means 'coming' so this is a time when we prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ at Christmas. Christ came to us as a baby in Bethlehem on the first Christmas. He comes to us in Word, grace, prayer and sacrament. He will also come again at the end of time to judge the living and the dead. Christ comes in history, mystery and majesty. So, before the opening hymn begins during the next four Advent Sundays, we will light the Advent candle and say a prayer in preparation for our Saviour's imminent arrival.

**PRAYER TO JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE:** Let us, on this last Sunday of the Church year, acknowledge the ultimate victory of our eternal King. The following prayer may assist in that regard:

O Jesus Christ, I acknowledge You as universal King. All that has been made, has been created for You. Exercise all Your rights over me. I renew my baptismal vows, and I promise to live as a good Christian. In particular, I pledge myself to labour, to the best of my ability, for the triumph of the rights of God and Your Church.

Divine Heart of Jesus, to You I offer my poor services, labouring that all hearts may acknowledge Your Sacred Kingship, and that the reign of Your peace be established throughout the whole universe. Amen.
