Twenty Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year C 25 September 2016

The Right Reverend Vincent Long Van Nguyen DD OFM Conv., Bishop of Parramatta and Chairman of the Australian Catholic Social Justice Council, will launch this vital, timely study after the 9.30am Mass and a 'cuppa' in the Parish Hall. Proceedings commence about 11.00am and conclude approximately an hour later at 11.55am. A light lunch will follow! So, please accept this invitation to meet our new Bishop Vincent, and be part of this most important Diocesan/Parish event. We also welcome Sister Louise McKeogh from the Diocesan Social Justice Office, as well as representatives from CatholicCare Social Services Blacktown Neighbourhood Aid Tracey Brassington, Irene Vasey and Valerie Turton.

In his foreword to the Statement, ACSJC Chairman Bishop Vincent writes:

"We are seeing a new vision of ageing, one where many people enter their 60s and 70s in good health and with plenty of skills and energy to offer our communities. Indeed, governments have seen this change and have called for people to remain in the workplace beyond the traditional retirement age. For many, that is a realistic expectation: but for it to be realised, aovernments and employers must recognise the true capacities of older people. They must also acknowledge that not all older people are healthy or well-off. We face a threefold challenge to work for an inclusive society that brings older people into the heart of the community; to ensure the dignity and care of people who are frail and most vulnerable to neglect or abuse; and to foster solidarity among all generations, recognising the special affinity that exists between the young and the old."

Pope Francis leads us in this endeavour when he says: "Just as God asks us to be his means of hearing the cry of the poor, so too he wants us to hear the cry of the elderly." He goes on and concludes by saying: "Indeed, how I would like a Church that challenges the throw-away culture by the overflowing joy of a new embrace between the young and old!" See you there!
