

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY: Over the past couple of weeks, I have drawn your attention to today's celebration of Jesus' Divine Mercy on this Divine Mercy Sunday. As mentioned last week. Pope John Paul II initiated this Feast when canonizing St Faustina Kowalska on 30th April 2000. So, this is a recentlyintroduced major feast. Our readings this day are all about mercy, trust and the forgiveness of sins. Locally, you are invited to attend the special celebrations, reconciliation and Mass commencing about 2.45pm this afternoon at Leura's St Bonaventure's Church in Railway Parade. Incorporating the practice of Divine Mercy into the more general activities of our Catholic faith. including the daily recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet. has become a permanent daily feature in the praver life of so many Catholics in this age. You are most welcome to join today's celebration!

HOLY WEEK/EASTER REVIEW: The last week of Lent with its flow-in to Easter via the Triduum, attracted a remarkable number of local parishioners and visitors whose numbers were beyond my ability to count. Suffice to say that every Mass and liturgy drew numbers way beyond my expectations, with the possible exception of the Saturday Vigil Mass at Blackheath where only about 45 persons attended, the Good Friday sunset visit to Mt Blackheath where only one person turned up at the starting point and the Sunrise Service at Govett's Leap about which I have no knowledge at this time. However, Easter Sunday Mass attendances were quite spectacular. The 7am Mt Victoria Mass, with its capacity of 50 seats, had over 40 in attendance, while down in Megalong Valley the 11.30am Mass given its 30 seat capacity, overflowed with, say, 50+ parishioners and visitors present. As for the 9.30am Blackheath Mass, I have no idea regarding numbers of people attending that Mass. Suffice to say that all the extra seats were occupied, plus people standing both inside and outside the church, some under the awning. Maybe 250? Who knows! As for attendances at the other liturgies; they were each well above my expectations. Particularly well received was the 'new' Stations of the Cross presentation in Sacred Heart Church using locally-produced print material and the A/V system. Everything went like clockwork throughout the week. That did NOT just happen of its own accord! You - our volunteers worked so hard to produce these results. You have much of which to be proud. Other parishioners and a wide selection of visitors have been so generous in their congratulations because of the spiritual atmosphere created and the competence in the results achieved through your efforts. Well done, indeed! By-the-way, did I say that the music, too, was superb!

We must never forget, however, that we did all this because of our devotion to, and love for Jesus, our Christ, whom we thank for everything He has done for each of us, plus all that He continues to do for both you and me! Amen.
