LAETARE SUNDAY: Today, the Fourth Sunday of Lent, is one of the two occasions in the Church year when the priest is entitled to wear pink vestments. I might add that this is an optional choice which is just as well given that I don't possess vestments of that colour. The word "Laetare" is taken from the first word of today's Entrance Antiphon whose English translation from the original Latin means "Rejoice with Jerusalem!". The other Sunday for pink vestments is "Gaudete" Sunday that occurs on the Third Sunday of Advent. From this Sunday forward our attention will particularly focus on Jesus' Passion, Crucifixion, Death and Resurrection.

FORMATION OF SOCIAL JUSTICE GROUP: As foreshadowed at our last (2015) AGM, the need for, and establishment of, a Social Justice Group working within the framework of the Parish Council has reached a point where today, following the 9.30am Mass, a meeting of interested parishioners is to be held in the Parish Hall to hear Sr Louise McKeogh FMA, the Parramatta Diocese Social Justice leader.



Have you thought? The Prodigal

Because the only context in which most people ever hear the word *prodigal* is in relation to this parable, there is a common misunderstanding of the word. Because the parable is also referred to as the parable of the lost son, many people think prodigal means lost. However, to be prodigal means to be wastefully extravagant. When the son took his father's money he adopted a prodigal lifestyle. However, the irony of the story that is often lost is that the father too was prodigal in the extravagant welcome he gave. The father's extravagance echoes God's extravagant and abundant grace and love.
