

HOLY WEEK: At last! After five long weeks of Lenten struggle we have	The	HOLY WEEK AND EASTER MASSES AND LITURGIES
reached the last week of Lent - Holy Week! This coming week is the most significant period in the Church year as it encompasses the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus. The number of liturgies planned for this week, the days and times of which are detailed in this bulletin, confirm the singular importance of this Season in our Church year. As we near the Paschal Feast of Easter Sunday, we are now able to reflect on how well we have done in our endeavours to achieve those personal goals we have set during this time. Did we review, revise and renew enough to bring us closer to God and neighbour in the practice of our Catholic faith? I certainly hope so, for that is what Lent is all about. Passion (Palm) Sunday introduces us to the profound events of Holy Week by demonstrating the changing nature of human behaviour presented for us to consider on this day. First, we have the crowd's stated intention of installing Jesus as their king; less than a week later that same crowd calls for his crucifixion and death. Just how fickle can human nature be! For all the suffering endured by Jesus through his Passion and Death, the critical act of salvation by Him occurred early on Easter Sunday morning through his Resurrection. Without Jesus' Resurrection from the dead, the Catholic Church could not have been established and you and I would not have been here now. All that occurs during this coming week leads us inexorably to the events of Easter Sunday morning – Jesus' Resurrection.
