

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY: Over the past couple of weeks, I have drawn your attention to today's celebration of **Jesus' Divine Mercy** on this **Divine Mercy** Sunday. As mentioned last week, Pope John Paul II initiated this Feast when canonizing St Faustina Kowalska on 30th April 2000. So this is a recently introduced major feast. This day's readings are always about mercy, trust and the forgiveness of sins. Locally, you are invited to attend the special celebrations, reconciliation and Mass commencing 3.00pm today at Leura's St Bonaventure's Church. Incorporating the practice of **Divine Mercv** into the more general activities of our Catholic faith, including the daily 3.00pm recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet, has become a permanent feature of our daily prayer life worldwide in the Church. Have you yet become part of this Divine Mercy prayer regime? If not, perhaps now might be a good time to try!

HOLY WEEK/EASTER - A FINAL WORD: Despite the wet weather, attendances at all Holy Week Liturgies and Masses, including the core Easter Triduum, more than matched last year's record-breaking attendances throughout this spiritually intense, personally demanding and most satisfying week, in my opinion. The three Easter Sunday Masses alone attracted in excess of 400 people. Many parishioners and visitors have thanked us for making this a most memorable experience for them. This did not happen by accident! Examples I saw: The flower team, at 8.00am on a very wet and miserable Easter Saturday morning hard at it preparing our magnificent Blackheath floral display; the choir rehearsing those many evenings to produce the wonderful music we enjoyed; the Blackheath Stations of the Cross that had to be relocated at no notice from the forest area to the dry church interior - with great success: the wet weather trek by six volunteers to Walls Cave to secure creek water for use that evening in the Vigil Mass; the hardy eight people who shared the unique experience gained at Mt Blackheath in the rain learning about indigenous culture around a camp fire to the soothing tones of a didgeridoo; although not personally present, reports tell me that the Easter Sunrise Service at Phillip's Lookout was equally significant: the Friday afternoon Passion of Jesus, Saturday Vigil Mass and Blackheath Sunday Mass planned in large measure at short notice by one person; Megalong Valley's Ecumenical Service so successfully planned and executed by virtually one local. Add to these parishioners, the immense amount of work completed by our Grounds Team, particularly in the forest and church grounds. Et cetera, et cetera!!! A truly phenomenal effort on the part of just about every parishioner. I thank you, and so does everyone who walked with us throughout our Holy Week and Easter commitments. So take a bow, everyone! You have earned it! Also, I must not forget to thank on behalf of all, Fr Paul Hanna for his tremendous input so willingly and so freely given. Huge thanks, Fr Paul!

At the end of the day, however, we need to remember that we did this because of our devotion to, and love for, Jesus, and we thank Him for everything He has done, plus all He continues to do for you, and for me! Amen!
