

LENTEN MESSAGE FROM HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS: "Dear Brothers and Sisters. Lent is a time of renewal for the whole Church, for each community and every believer. Above all, it is a time of grace (2 Cor.6:2). God does not ask of us anything that he himself has not first given us. 'We love because he has first loved us' (1 In 4:19). He is not aloof from us. Each one of us has a place in his heart. He knows us by name, he cares for us and he seeks us out whenever we turn away from him. He is interested in each of us; his love does not allow him to be indifferent to what happens to us. Usually, when we are healthy and comfortable, we forget about others (something God the Father never does): we are unconcerned with their problems, their sufferings and the injustices they endure...Our heart grows cold. As long as I am relatively healthy and comfortable, I don't think about those less well off. Today, this selfish attitude of indifference has taken on alobal proportions, to the extent that we can speak of a alobalisation of indifference. It is a problem which we, as Christians, need to confront." Kindly note that this is an excerpt only of a much longer Lenten Message from the Holy Father. What a simply worded direct message from our leader!

NEW APOSTOLIC NUNCIO APPOINTED: His Holiness Pope Francis has appointed as Apostolic Nuncio to Australia, His Excellency Most Reverend Adolfo Tito Yllana until now Apostolic Nuncio to the Democratic Republic of Congo. Born in Naga City, Philippines, in February 1948, he was ordained priest in the Philippines in 1972. Following his doctorate in civil and canon law and a study stint in Rome, he was ordained bishop in January 2002, then appointed Apostolic Nuncio to Papua New Guinea. We welcome His Excellency to our nation and Church, and may his time with us be both fruitful and productive for all in this Commonwealth.

NEW BLUE MOUNTAINS REGION ACTING DEAN: Rev. Fr Paul Slynev. Parish Priest of Lawson and Springwood, has been appointed Acting Dean of our region for the time being. We have now been able to set a date for our reformed next Deanery meeting to be held on Wednesday, 18 March. Preceding this meeting will be a Diocesan gathering of all priests at Parramatta on 11 March. Will keep you informed of any developments as they occur.


