Judgment (Mt 24), that reminds us that whatever we do for the least in the world we do for Jesus. Jesus even describes the disciples as 'little ones' - a reminder both to them and to those who welcome them.

I recall looking at the headstone of the Cumnock parish priest (that's not too far from Orange in the central west of NSW). He survived 38 years in that one place before he passed on. Intellectually, too, the world was a much slower and more relaxed place, though physically much more demanding in that pre-WWII era. Dirt roads and cars that kept breaking down at the side of the road meant that most people staved local. Our neighbours were our friends! Families could be spread around quite a bit, with infrequent mostly written contact between them complemented by the occasional personal visit, generally by sooty slow steam train.

Compare that to today. Trains are 'out'! Planes are 'in'! Cars also are OK, especially for families. Distance is no longer a problem! Our best friend may well be quite some distance away from where we live. Doesn't matter! Just climb into the car - and go! A couple of hundred kilometres to travel is no big deal!
