





PARISH COUNCIL AGM: To be convened immediately following today's Mass in the Parish Hall. Every effort has been made to limit this AGM to about one hour for the convenience of all attending parishioners. Your council has gone to a lot of trouble to make this as user-friendly an event as possible, commensurate with imparting to you a full knowledge of all the work that our parish undertakes. You have much to be proud of in the work that you, and others of our parish family have contributed this past year. So, please join us on this one occasion each year when a full reporting on Sacred Heart Parish operations is presented to you. See you there!

ADVENT: Our present Church year ends next Saturday, 28th November. Sunday next begins the new Church year, Year C (Sundays) and year II (weekdays). New Church years seldom have the same starting date because Advent always begins on the Sunday closest to the Feast of St Andrew which is celebrated on 30th November. This year, that date falls on Monday week, only one day removed from the First Sunday in Advent. Advent has a twofold character – as a Season to prepare for Christmas when Christ's birth is remembered; and as a Season when that remembrance directs our hearts and minds to await Christ's coming at the end of time. Advent is, therefore, a period of joyful penance and expectation. Please note that our Christmas/ New Year Mass days and times will be listed here next week.

ADVENT WREATH: As already stated, next Sunday is the beginning of the Season of Advent. The word 'Advent' means 'coming' so this is a time when we prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ at Christmas. Christ came to us as a baby in Bethlehem on the first Christmas. He comes to us in word, grace, prayer and sacrament. He will also come again at the end of time to judge the living and the dead. Christ comes in history, mystery and majesty. So, before the opening hymn begins during the next four Advent Sundays, we will light the Advent Candle and say a prayer in preparation for our Saviour's imminent arrival.

REFLECTION ON THE YEAR THAT WAS (courtesy D. Bergant): "Throughout this liturgical year we have examined several aspects of our faith. We have pondered the history of our salvation, the merciful compassion of God, God's willingness to lead us out of the bondage of our addictions. We have meditated often and long on the person of Jesus, on His life and death, on the meaning of His sacrifice, on His Resurrection, on His influence on our lives today. We have considered our own ongoing transformation as disciples of Jesus, baptised into His death and Resurrection, commissioned to bring His love to all those with whom we come into contact. We have reflected on all these wonderful deeds of God, and now we must ask and answer the question: What difference has it made? We pray that this year has seen you draw ever closer to God by giving more of yourself to Him and others."

APPROPOS OF? While on retreat at Jamberoo, as there was no Mass on the Thursday, I went to that day's 8am Mass at St Peter & St Paul's Kiama church. Guess what? There in the courtyard enjoying pride of place was our old bell! Ah well, at least it's being well looked after.
