

A new ELECTRONIC OPTION for the Second Collection

Many people these days make or receive regular payments electronically. It's a simple, efficient and safe way to transfer money from one bank or credit union account to another. So we've decided to offer you an electronic transfer option to make your **Second Collection** contribution each week. **Many of you already contribute to the Second Collection using the envelope system and that system will continue.** But this new option will save you having to remember to get your cash ready, then put it in the envelope and bring it along to Mass. It also cuts down on the work involved in counting and banking collection money each week.

And if you are one of the many people in our parish who live and attend Mass elsewhere but who also spends time in the Blue Mountains and regularly attends Mass at Sacred Heart, this might be a way for you to make regular contributions to your "second" parish.

To take advantage of this new option, just set up a weekly direct transfer facility through your bank or credit union. The details for the Sacred Heart account to which you would make the transfer are:

Please ensure that you include your Second Collection envelope number in the transaction Reference or transaction Description to appear on the Sacred Heart receiving account. This number currently appears at the top of your envelopes. If you don't currently contribute to the Second Collection using the envelopes, please contact the Parish Office and we will arrange a Second Collection reference number for you. REMEMBER: The envelope collection will remain the same nothing changes - this is just an alternative way to contribute if you would prefer to use a direct debit system rather than a paper one. When you move to the new system, you will not need envelopes in future, but we will retain your envelope reference number to identify your contribution.

BISHOP'S COLLECTION FOR RETIRED AND SICK CLERGY

The Clergy Support Foundation of the Diocese of Parramatta assists in meeting the needs of the retired and sick priests of the Diocese, and an annual appeal, 'The Bishop's Collection for Retired and Sick Clergy', is held on Father's Day each year to support the Foundation. It is hoped to raise \$200,000 each year through this appeal.

Last year, through your generosity we almost reached the target with donations totalling \$195,000 and the Foundation thanks you for this contribution. This year the appeal in the Diocese will be held on the weekend of September 5-6. A third collection will be held on this weekend at each Mass. **Special envelopes will be available and all donations over \$2 are tax deductible.** If you wish to claim a tax deduction, please tick the box and write your details clearly on the envelope. Appeal envelopes will be available next week for those who will not be here on the Father's Day weekend.

World Day of Migrants and Refugees ~ Next Sunday ~ 30 August

Pope Francis, himself the son of Italian immigrants who made their home in Argentina, in his message for the 101st World Day of Migrants and Refugees 2015, has chosen the theme 'Church without frontiers, Mother to all'. Francis reminds us, "as Christians, it is our mandate to care for others and in particular the most vulnerable – spreading throughout the world a culture of acceptance and solidarity, in which no one is seen as useless, out of place or disposable".

Pope Francis continues "... large numbers of people are leaving their homelands, with a suitcase full of fears and desires to undertake a hopeful and dangerous trip in search of more humane living conditions. Often, however, such migration gives rise to suspicion and hostility, even in ecclesial communities (Yes, including Australia!), prior to any knowledge of the migrants' lives or their stories of persecution and destitution. Such suspicion and prejudice is in conflict with the biblical commandment of welcomina with respect and solidarity the stranger in need!" To put some of these challenges in a more local context, after Mass and following our International Morning Tea in the hall, we shall have the opportunity to listen to **Dr Graeme Swincer**, from the Blue Mountains Refugee Support Group. Graeme has had a lifetime in international aid and development and in January 2015 he was awarded an Order of Australia Medal "For service to the community through humanitarian support organisations". In more recent years, Graeme has been closely involved with the Blue Mountains Refugee Support Group and the Villawood Immigration Detention Centre. Of course, Migrant and Refugee Sunday is also a time to celebrate the arrival of the thousands of refugees and migrants from many different countries who have graced our shores over many years and who have made such a wonderful contribution to our Community - both locally and nationally. This, too, will be reflected in our Eucharistic Liturgy.

Please feel free to bring a plate of International Fare to continue our celebration over morning tea!
