Gospel Focus - Messiah

At the time of Jesus there was a heightened expectation that the Messiah - the anointed one of God - would come and once again set the people of *Israel free. However, there was areat* conjecture about what sort of person the Messiah would be. Some thought he would be a warrior king; others a wise priestly leader; others thought a shepherd-king in the image of David. *Confounding all these expectations.* Iesus' model of Messianic leadership was that of the servant leader; a leader who was one with the people, offering hope and meaning in the midst of their everyday suffering and struggling.
