

ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER SUNDAY: Today is that one day each year when we especially focus our attention on the gifts, needs and wants of our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander brothers and sisters. This is also the beginning of a week of celebrations throughout the nation where these first Australians celebrate their spirituality, identity, culture and survival. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholics bring beautiful gifts to the Church in Australia, and so it is on this day that we join with them to celebrate these gifts. This year's theme chosen by NATSICC is "We all stand on Sacred Ground." To bring a greater level of understanding to this celebration, I quote from a statement by Deacon Boniface Perdiert, Wadeve NT when he says... "Deep down, we Aborigines are religious people. We did not have many material goods, but we are rich with spiritual goods. It is this strong religious side that made us. It gave us our identity, dignity, our self-assurance. My people existed here in Australia thousands of years before Abraham. In all that time, God was with my people. He worked through their culture. He was saving us despite our human weakness. He was preparing us for the day we would see the features of Aborigines in the image of His Son." So, let us acknowledge all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders for their past and current presence among us, and support them in every possible way.



We all Stand on Sacred Ground: Learn, Respect and Celebrate **National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday**

For 2015, the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council decided to adopt the National NAIDOC Theme for the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday -

We all Stand on Sacred Ground.

There is a great parallel with today's Gospel ... where Jesus is not recognised in his own land and a definite resonance

of recent talk of closing remote Aboriginal Communities in Western Australia. They, too, find themselves in Jesus' shoes – not accepted in their own land!

Our land, known as Australia, is sacred. It is Sacred in the beliefs, culture and Spirituality of our Indigenous Brothers and Sisters. It is also sacred to our Faith.

Welcome to Country and Acknowledgement of Traditional Owners

An 'Acknowledgement of Country' is a way that all people can show awareness and respect for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture and heritage and the ongoing relationship the traditional owners have with their land.

Both Indigenous and non-Indigenous people can perform 'Acknowledgement of Country'. It is a demonstration of respect dedicated to the traditional custodians of the land.

Prior to European settlement of Australia, the region of Blackheath and surrounding areas were thought to be a summer corroboree meeting place for several Aboriginal nations, these being Darug (East), Gundungurra (South) and Wiradjuri (West). Some descendants of these people still reside in the modern township and the surrounding areas.

For our Celebration this Sunday, our Liturgy Group has chosen the following:

The Sacred Heart Catholic Parish acknowledges the Darug, Gundungurra and Wiradjuri people, the Traditional Owners who have walked upon and cared for this land for thousands of years. We acknowledge the continued deep spiritual attachment and relationship of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples to this country and commit ourselves to the ongoing journey of Reconciliation.
