The Feast of the Assumption (15th August) celebrates the belief that the body and soul of the Blessed Virgin Mary was taken into heaven after the end of her earthly life. Mary's assumption into heaven is seen by many as a fulfilment of Jesus' promise to all faithful servants; that they too will be received into the kingdom of God. Mary is seen as the first disciple of Jesus and a model for all disciples; it is fitting that she receive the gift of discipleship first of all. Belief in the Assumption of Mary had become widespread by the end of the seventh century and was eventually defined in an

infallible statement by Pope Pius XII in 1950. Where humanly possible, we are each obliged to attend morning Mass on that day (the vigil Mass does not count), even though that may involve travel to an adjoining area. Attendance at this Mass does not exempt us from being present at the Sunday Mass or its Saturday Vigil Mass.

Last Sunday we were blessed to have Fr John lead us in the first of our Eucharistic Celebrations while Fr Bob is away on holidays. Contrary to earlier advice, Fr John turned out to be the Parish Priest of St Andrea Kaahwa's Parish in Fort Portal, Uganda. He is in Australia for just 3 months. And 'out of the blue' Fr John asked if he could appeal for our community's help ... helping him raise funds for badly needed transport facilities in his parish – 1 Toyota Hilux twin cab and 2 motorcycles. Among many objectives, better transport will facilitate easier and timelier access to Parish outstations, help reduce maternal and infant mortality and intensify their community campaign against domestic violence.

And what an appeal it was – so genuine and from the heart! As always our Sacred Heart Community came to the fore – with outstanding generosity. \$1009 cash was raised (along with several cheques) in the 'spur of the moment' retiring collection – 2/3 the cost of one motorcycle! As possibly the smallest Parish in the Diocese, we can be very proud - Thank You!! And Thanks to Bill and Barbara for showing Fr John and his driver wonderful Blue Mountains hospitality!

Many parishioners came unprepared and could not donate on the day. If you would like to contribute, special envelopes are available in the sacristy today and these can be placed in a basket also in the sacristy. A few more of Fr John's flyers have been run off and are also available in the sacristy.

On Sunday 30 August, we shall be celebrating the 101st World Day of Migrants and Refugees. The theme for this year's celebration is: *Church without frontiers, Mother to all.*

Over many decades our country has been blessed through the arrival of refugees and migrants from many different countries. Some have arrived after fleeing persecution and hardship in their country of birth, others through simple attraction to our shores - the overall dream of making a better life for themselves and their loved ones - here in Australia.

Our Liturgy and Ministry group is looking to celebrate the many gifts brought to us by those in our community who are refugees or migrants. It is also an opportunity for us to look at some of the social justice issues that confront us in today's world of refugees and people smuggling.

As part of our Liturgy, we are seeking help from those who can lead us in our Intercessional Prayer ... in their own native tongue. To continue our celebration after Mass, we are also planning to make morning tea that day (in the hall) an international event – hopefully with a guest speaker from the Blue Mountains Refugee Support Group to talk to us about some of the current issues facing migrants and refugees in Australia today.
