

These annual gatherings are the most important to be convened by the parish each year, because tabled is to be a full audit (both financial and physical) of all that has occurred in our Sacred Heart Parish during the preceding financial year ended 30 June 2017.

If you want to know what we have done, where we are at or what plans for the future we have, this meeting will certainly be the place to find out!

As explained in last week's Bulletin, this year is also an election year at which half the council members will be retiring, to be replaced by an equal number, five in all, who, once elected, will take up their appointment as parish councillor from 1 January 2018. To date there are eight nominees according to Chairman David Buckley, so an election will need to be carried out during the AGM. Should you wish to add your name to those who have already offered their services to the parish in this capacity, you have until the end of today to do so as nominations close at that time. While each day is important in the life of every parish, it is especially so for this parish at this time.

A number of new strategies have been introduced during the past year and, undoubtedly, more will be adopted in the year ahead. This is your last opportunity to be part of that decision-making process during the next two years. Congratulations to those who have already nominated for election as Councillor; all parishioners are proud of you for "having a go".

NEW PARISH PRIESTS FOR THE UPPER BLUE MOUNTAINS: One significant change that is to come into effect from 1 February 2018 affects the neighbouring "Katoomba" Parish with which we have always enjoyed a very close association. Following his retirement in September last, Father Ted Tyler has been temporarily replaced with one of my old friends, Father Eugene Szondi who, from the above date, is to take up a new appointment as Assistant Priest at St John Vianney Parish, Doonside. He will be replaced by two priests, Rev. Carlos Walker IVE and Rev. John (Sean) Bradley IVE. Rev. Carlos Walker IVE is also appointed to the position of Moderator of the Katoomba Parish. Their appointments are for six years dating from 1 February 2018.

We extend to our two new neighbouring priests every success, happiness, friendship and support in the years ahead in our Upper Blue Mountains community. May the Katoomba Parish thrive under their guidance through, and with, God's love and the wonderful support of their parishioners!
