Hence last Sunday's distribution of our parish performance reports for your early consideration prior to the AGM to help speed-up this most important meeting. Your council has gone to a lot of trouble to make this as user-friendly an event as possible, commensurate with imparting to you a full knowledge and appreciation of all the work our parish undertakes. You have much to be proud of in the work that you and others of our Sacred Heart 'family' have contributed this past year. So, please join us on this once-yearly occasion when a full reporting on parish activities is presented to you. Oh! By-the-way, morning tea will (as ever) be provided immediately before the AGM starts. See you there!

ADVENT: Our present Church year ends next Saturday, 2nd December. Sunday next heralds in the new Church Year, Year B (Sundays) and Year II (weekdays). New Church years seldom have the same starting date because Advent always begins on the Sunday closest to the Feast of St Andrew which is celebrated on 30th November. This year that date falls next Thursday. Advent has a twofold character – as a Season to prepare for Christmas when Christ's birth is remembered; and as a Season when that remembrance directs our hearts and minds to await Christ's second coming at the end of time. So, before the opening hymn begins during the next four Advent Sundays, we will light the Advent Candle and say a prayer in preparation for our Saviour's imminent arrival.

PRAYER TO JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE: Let us, on this last Sunday of the Church Year, acknowledge the ultimate victory of our eternal King. The following prayer may assist in that regard:

O Jesus Christ, I acknowledge you as Universal King.

All that has been made, has been created for you. Exercise all your rights over me.

I renew my Baptismal vows, and I promise to live as a good Christian.

In particular, I pledge myself to labour, to the best of my ability, for the triumph of the rights of God and your Church. Divine Heart of Jesus, to you I offer my poor services,

Labouring that all hearts may acknowledge Your Sacred Kingship,

And that the reign of Your peace be established throughout the whole universe. Amen.

VINNIES CHRISTMAS APPEAL 2017 St Vincent de Paul Society Sacred Heart Blackheath Conference is humbled, and the people we assist are blessed by the generosity of this Parish.
