

LENT: It's not often that we celebrate both Ash Wednesday and St Valentine's Day on the same day in any year. However, such is the case this year. What a contrast! Today we move spiritually from 'Ordinary Time' to 'Lent'. Over the next 36 days we will have many opportunities to join Lenten activities that will help us form an ever closer relationship with God and each other – a time when we seek to revise, renew and reset our priorities in this life. Lent is that special time of the year when the liturgies are particularly framed to support us as we self-analyse where we are at, where we want to be, and how best to reach that goal. Yes! Lent is a time for action!
