ASCENSION SUNDAY: Today we celebrate the second of the three major feasts that together make up the Easter Season. First, of course, is Easter Sunday and Jesus' Resurrection from the dead. This day we celebrate Christ's return to his Father in heaven via the Feast we call the Ascension – it being the Sunday following the original Feast of Ascension Thursday, the actual 40th day following Easter Sunday. Last of all is the Feast of Pentecost where we celebrate the descent of the Paraclete (the Most Holy Spirit, third person of the Divine Trinity) to be our Advocate, and to take Jesus' place among all people in every generation. That Feast is celebrated next Sunday. Tradition sort of tells us that Jesus' Ascension took place in the same Garden of Gethsemane where he had just a few weeks earlier suffered the beginning of the trauma that was his Passion and Death. However, Luke's version of this event would have us believe that Jesus ascended into heaven from Bethany, a village then located about 3kms from Jerusalem. So! Take vour pick!

With Jesus on this occasion were those closest to him, to bear witness to his physical departure from us for his journey home - to Heaven - from whence he had originally come to us. We perhaps also need to be reminded that it was Jesus in his human life who took on board every sin ever committed by us in every generation - past, present and future - and through his life, passion, crucifixion and death he expiated our sins and thus opened the gates of heaven to all of us. And that is a debt you and I can never ever repay!

Remember, too, that it is our king and saviour Jesus who, at his second coming, will adjudicate on the life we each have lived here when this world reaches its end!
