He also has gained permanent employment as a house painter to consolidate his position with us here. Having escaped from the trauma afflicting his home country, it is wonderful to see how well Patrick has adjusted to and been assimilated into our community. We all from Blackheath's Sacred Heart 'family' congratulate both Alison and Patrick on their marriage. We also extend to them every good wish for the future and offer them our unqualified support in the years ahead as a valued local family.

MOTHERS' DAY ONE WEEK TO GO: Mothers' Day is the one day in the year when we make that special effort to honour our "Mum". Did you know that, traditionally, Mums were in the past always recognised in church? Parishioners wore carnations to symbolise the love they had for their mothers, both living and deceased.
