

Our parish priest!

Bishop Vincent for the very first time is spending much of this weekend with us including last evening's overnight stay in our Blackheath Presbytery.

Spiritually, Bishop Vincent is the best friend we can possibly have. We need always to remember that as the Apostle of Christ directly responsible for helping us to safely negotiate that quagmire of life we lead - that quagmire in which we can, and so often do very easily become preoccupied with the things of this life, and then forget the real reason we are here - to learn Christ's ways while getting to better know and serve our beloved creator God.

WORLD DAY FOR MIGRANTS AND REFUGEES: Today is the one day each year when we particularly focus our attention towards the plight of migrants and refugees. As today is the 104<sup>th</sup> such day to be commemorated, we have to acknowledge that this problem of migrants and refugees is ongoing, and sadly will continue to be so! Bishop Vincent leaves us with a succinct message re this occasion – "Dear Brothers and sisters in Christ, the Holy Father, Pope Francis, has chosen as the theme for the 104<sup>th</sup> World Day of Migrants and Refugees, 'Welcoming, protecting, promoting and integrating migrants and refugees'. Reflecting on his Pontificate and global events in the last five years, the Holy Father reminds us of the urgent need to care for our displaced brothers and sisters, who have been forced to leave their homes for a better future. He makes the parable of the Last Judgment concrete by stating that every act of charity shown to migrants and refugees is an opportunity to encounter Christ'. Here in this parish we have a proven record of practical support for both migrants and refugees with some success. However, we must never be complacent about what we have done, but more conscious of the need that continues to exist, hence this reminder!
