There are two items this week that have been re-listed from last week's Bulletin. They are Social Justice Sunday and Daylight Saving, the last-mentioned entry being shown with the proper dates. Apologies for last week's dual blunders!!!

SOCIAL JUSTICE SUNDAY: Today (not last Sunday) is Social Justice Sunday. The 2018 – 2019 Statement, titled "A Place to call Home: Making a home for everyone in our land", is a response to the growing problem of homelessness in Australia. It seems hard to believe that in a rich nation such as ours, the latest Census figures show that the number of Australians who are homeless has grown to more than 116,000. House prices and even rents are spiralling out of reach of too many families and placing huge financial stress on ordinary people, even when they are employed. For those living on pensions or allowances, finding secure housing can be a far greater challenge – one that takes a terrible toll on social wellbeing and mental health.

The Statement examines the extent of Australia's homelessness and housing crisis. It emphasises that secure housing is a human right and an incontestable public good, affirmed by both Catholic teaching and the Declaration of Human Rights. In conclusion, it issues a challenge to government, to Church, to community and to us as individuals to bring about change and reform.

Copies of the Statement are available for download on the websites of the Australian Catholic Bishop's Conference (www.catholic.org.au), and the Australian Social Justice Council (www.socialjustice.catholic.org.au). Copies are also available in the church.

DAYLIGHT SAVING (I've got it right this time!): This year, daylight saving begins next Sunday morning (7th October) when all timepieces are to be wound forward one hour from 2am, which then becomes 3am. Best to do that before you go to bed on the Saturday evening. Come summer's end, daylight saving will end next year at 3am on Sunday morning 7th April 2019. Hope that helps with your forward planning!

SCHOOL'S OUT: School holidays are now with us, and will continue for the next two weeks until schools return for the fourth term on Monday, 15th October. Kindly note that this last term for 2018 ends just before Christmas on Thursday, 20th December 2018. Please everyone, with so many children about during this holiday time, take extra special care to ensure the safety of all.

MARY'S MONTH OF OCTOBER: This is the month of the Rosary! Pope John Paul II on the 29th September 2002 had this to say about the Rosary: "...The Rosary is a way of contemplating the face of Christ, seeing Him – we may say – with the eyes of Mary. For this reason, it is a prayer that drawing upon the core of the Gospel, is in full accord with the inspiration of the Second Vatican Council and very much in keeping with the direction I gave in the Apostolic Letter Novo Millenio Ineunte: the Church has to launch out "into the deep" in the new millennium

beginning with the contemplation of the face of Christ. Therefore, I wish to suggest the recitation of the Rosary to individuals, families and Christian communities." As usual, the Rosary will be recited at the conclusion of every weekday Mass during October. So feel free to join us for this purpose at any time. God Bless! Fr. Bob


