A neighbouring parish gave us a small number of the needed envelopes which we dutifully used with limited fund-raising success. CHILD PROTECTION SUNDAY: Once again, today concludes that special week set aside for us each year to again highlight the need for us to focus particular attention towards the protection and safety of children and other vulnerable youth and adults within our community. I recall when, as a child, I used to wander the streets, paddocks and playgrounds in complete safety. Perhaps at times I and my mates were a bit of a nuisance to the adults in our local area, particularly when our billy carts took over the street to race. I remember collecting manure from nearby paddocks in the same billy carts and selling them door-to-door around the district. However, never was our safety ever at risk! Not so today! Children, whether ours or someone else's, are precious to everyone, and they are so innocent and so vulnerable! Whoever they belong to, we need to be ever aware of any risky things that children may get themselves into, and to take remedial steps wherever we can. We all carry that responsibility!

In 2016, following a proposal from the Pontifical Commission for the protection of Minors, the Holy Father established a "Day of prayer and penance for the victims of sexual abuse, and to ask God for a greater awareness of the responsibility of the members of the Church towards the underage people entrusted to them". Here in Australia, this second stated purpose is already a focus of Child Protection Sunday on the second Sunday of September each year. This decision was taken by the Australian College of Bishops' Conference as the day of prayer and penance for the victims of sexual abuse.

CONFIRMATION NEXT SUNDAY: While it will only have been three weeks since Bishop Vincent spent that memorable overnight weekend with us, he will none-theless return next weekend (16/9) to confirm into full Catholic faith five of our young people – Alicia MALIFANT, Rachelle Kate BISHOP-JONES, Lucas TARANTO, Natalia TARANTO and Sophia SHEERE. Co-ordinated by Michelle DAVIS, with guided instruction by Chantelle BURKE and team, all five aspirants have been well prepared for this most significant day in their lives through their receipt of this last of the four Sacraments of Initiation – Confirmation! Please pray for each of these young persons and their families! Let's also thank Michelle, Chantelle and her team for the wonderful results accorded these children for the greater glory of God!
