ADVENT - FIRST SUNDAY (theme - 'Expectation'): In the midst of the pre-Christmas frenzy of buying gifts and shopping, it is easy to lose sight of the profound spiritual importance of the Advent Season when there are many extra demands placed on our time. Pre-Christmas preparations can be fun but it is important to balance that with the spiritual side of the Advent Season and its associated Christmas Day. This week, it would be a good idea to devote a little more time for reflection and prayer, and experience the joy and peace the Babe of Bethlehem brings at Christmas. Today is the first of the four Sundays of Advent. The Advent Wreath will be used today for the first time this year, led at the beginning of each Mass by parish families who will introduce each week's prayer for us to share as the candle is lit while we respond: "Let this candle remind us that Jesus is coming!"

Week 1 – Lighting of the purple candle with this week's Advent Prayer:

"O Jesus Christ, Emmanuel, come and dwell with us. Desire of all nations; gift to every generation, come, make your home with us. All nations, everybody is waiting for you, all races here and throughout The world are waiting for you. Jesus, come to us. Amen."

THE ADVENT WREATH: The circle of the wreath and the evergreens that make it up both signify God's endless mercy and undying love. Three purple candles and one rose coloured (pink) candle are evenly spaced around the wreath. There is one larger white candle in the centre of the wreath. Each week an additional candle is lit. As the light grows brighter each week, we are reminded that the Light of the World will soon arrive in glory. The largest central white candle signifies the Light of Christ and is first lit on Christmas Eve.

PARISH COUNCIL AGM REVIEW: Once again, congratulations to Diana Landsberg, chairperson, and to all councillors for their dedicated role in the successful administration of our Sacred Heart Parish this past year.
