PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL AGM:

Will be held in the Parish Hall immediately

After today's Mass. Every effort has been made time-wise to limit this AGM for the convenience of all attending parishioners. Your council has gone to a lot of trouble to make this as user-friendly an event as possible, commensurate with making available to you a full knowledge and appreciation of all the work our parish undertakes. You have much to be proud of in the work that you and others of our 'Sacred Heart family' have contributed this past year. Kindly note that, as our records for the financial year ended 30/2018 have still to be audited, the presented results are still 'pro-tem'. However, as we have never had to review our figures in past years, we are confident that the presented results are accurate this time round as well! So, please join us on this once-yearly occasion when a full reporting on parish activities will be presented to you. Oh! By-the-way, morning tea (as ever) will be provided immediately before the AGM starts. See you there!

ADVENT: Our present Church year ends next Saturday, 1st December. Sunday next heralds in the new Church Year, Year C (Sundays) and Year I (weekdays). New Church Years seldom have the same starting date because Advent always begins on the Sunday closest to the Feast of St. Andrew which is celebrated on the 30th November. This year that date falls next Friday. Advent has a twofold character – as a Season to prepare for Christmas when Christ's birth is celebrated; and as a Season when that remembrance directs our hearts and minds to await Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. Advent is, therefore, a period of joyful penance and expectation. Kindly note also that our Christmas/New Year Mass days and times will be available here next week.

ADVENT WREATH: As already stated, next Sunday is the beginning of the Season of Advent. The word 'Advent' means 'coming', so this is a time when we prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ at Christmas. Christ came to us as a baby in Bethlehem on the first Christmas. He comes to us in Word, grace, prayer and sacrament. He will also come again at the end of time to judge the living and the dead. Christ comes in history, mystery and majesty. So before the opening hymn begins during the next four Advent Sundays, we will light the Advent Candle and say a prayer in preparation for our Saviour's imminent arrival.

PRAYER TO JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE: Will you join with us on this last Sunday of this Church Year to acknowledge the ultimate victory of our eternal King. The following prayer may assist in that regard:

O Jesus Christ, I acknowledge you as universal King. All that has been made has been created for you. Exercise all your rights over me. I renew my Baptismal vows, and I promise to live as a good Christian. In particular, I pledge myself to labour to the best of my ability for the triumph of the rights of God and your Church. Divine heart of Jesus, to you I offer my poor services, labouring that all hearts may acknowledge Your Sacred Kingship. And that the reign of Your peace be established throughout the whole universe. Amen.
