Given the relatively few large items for sale this year, we (maybe?) expected about \$4,000+ this time. How wrong we were! With Saturday's weather very wet, the concern was that this was going to be a difficult year moneywise. Sunday's weather, however, was great – and the cash kept on rolling in! Only once before in the years I have been here, have we managed to sell more (2017: \$6,294.23). Given the special nature of our stock that year, we have performed way better than expected this year! Mind you, collection of saleable stock has been going on for more than six months, with a huge acceleration in that work after Christmas. The Marilyn/Paul combo actually visited a number of homes and other places to physically manhandle stock into their trailer, to be unloaded at the parish hall by the same duo plus others. Too, we have learnt a lot about conducting this event from past years with detailed planning occupying much time and effort over the last few months – especially by Marilyn with support from her volunteer 'team'. This parish survives through the efforts of its volunteers, and never has this been more evident than on this occasion with so many parishioners and visitors also tending to the plethora of needs/wants of so many happy customers. People like me! I am a sucker for this sort of thing! Can't help myself! How about you? Ah, well! All in a good cause! They say that 'job satisfaction' is at its best when great work is supported by even greater results – like now! Huge thanks to everyone involved in every facet of this year's Monster Garage Sale. Well done, indeed! PS. Didn't we give the sausage sandwiches a workout! Finally on this subject! Disposal of leftover stock is always a problem. Not so this year as most of the surplus books will end up in the Sudan; some larger items were sold through eBay, the Blacktown Sudanese community filled a van to the brim, and unsaleable 'things' were collected by the Council garbage collectors. Good job, well done evervone!

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER: This year's ecumenical World Day of Prayer is to be hosted by us, the Sacred Heart Parish, Blackheath. This early advice is given because of the recent death of Jan Roberts our long-term Catholic co-ordinator over many years. We urgently need a replacement volunteer co-ordinator from among our parishioners to undertake the task of organising this year's afternoon of prayer on Friday, 1st March from about 2.00pm – 3.00pm here at Sacred Heart. Light refreshments are to be provided by us and the other Christian Denominations under our guidance. Please contact me should you be able to assist on this occasion. Otherwise, if no one is interested, we could well have to postpone our involvement in this World Day of Prayer to another year.

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER AGAINST HUMAN TRAFFICKING: Last Friday (8/2) was the Feast Day of a lesser-known great saint, Saint Josephine Bakhita, who was enslaved in her childhood, passed through a number of brutal owners over many years, was eventually freed, joined a religious order in which she lived a saintly life and died in 1947 at 79 years. Saint Josephine was canonised in 2000 by Pope Saint John Paul II. This was the fifth International Day of Prayer and Awareness against Human Trafficking undertaken by the Church. Pope Francis considers this to be a global phenomenon in which millions of people today, children, women, men of all ages are deprived of freedom and forced to live in conditions akin to slavery. He considers this problem to be beyond the competence of any community or nation to resolve, hence this mobilization of awareness and prayer on a world scale by the Church. This anti-slavery feast should not be confused with the World Day of Prayer that dates back over 93 years with its origins in the USA (see full details above). *God Bless! Fr. Bob*
