LENTEN MESSAGE FROM HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS: "Dear Brothers and Sisters, Lent is a time of renewal for the whole Church, for each community and every believer. Above all, it is a time of grace. God does not ask of us anything he himself has not first given us. We love because he first loved us. He is not aloof from us. Each one of us has a place in his heart. He knows us by name, he cares for us and he seeks us out whenever we turn away from him. He is interested in each of us; his love does not allow him to be indifferent to what happens to us. Usually, when we are healthy and comfortable, we forget about others (something the Father never does): we are unconcerned with their problems, their sufferings and injustices they endure...our hearts grow cold. As long as I am relatively healthy and comfortable, I don't think about those less well off. Today, this selfish act of indifference has taken on global proportions, to the extent that we can speak of a globalisation of indifference. It is a problem which we, as Christians, need to confront." Please note that this is but a short except only of a much longer Lenten Message from the Holy Father. This is certainly a message we need to hear and put into practice throughout Lent – and beyond!

I also confirm that we, at this stage, do not have any candidate for Baptism during the Easter Saturday Vigil Mass and celebration.

CARITAS (**Project Compassion**): As mentioned in this Bulletin last week, Caritas is our key charity and fund-raiser for this year with donations being received throughout the Lenten/Easter period. Through Project Compassion, you and I have a unique opportunity to help Caritas Australia to support those far more deprived than us, by helping to reduce their poverty, promote justice for them and uphold the dignity that is the right of every living human being. You will find dispersed around the church today a range of Caritas literature, including Project Compassion boxes to be found at each of the three entrances to the Blackheath church. If you haven't already done so, please take one home with you, fill it with your spare coins, and return it to us at Easter. Huge thanks for your support!

FEAST OF THE ANNUNCIATION of the LORD: This Feast occurs tomorrow, Monday 25th March. However, because we do not celebrate Mass on Mondays due to my other commitments, I am transferring this Solemnity Feast to replace the normal scheduled Tuesday Mass at 6.00pm on 26th March this year only! Those of you who want to attend Mass tomorrow may do so at either Katoomba or Lithgow parish churches.


