LENT 2019: Wednesday next, 6th March, is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the forty-day period of Lent for this year. Ash Wednesday is, of course, a day of both fast and abstinence. As mentioned last week, Passion (Palm) Sunday falls on 14th April while Easter Sunday occurs on April 21, that being the first full moon following this year's March Autumnal Equinox (that day when both night and day are each an equal 12 hours). Apropos of little, Daylight Saving ends at 2.00am (which becomes 3.00am) on Sunday 7th April.

Lent is THE annual time of repentance, in which we are each expected to review our present lives and, where necessary revise, or at the very least, renew our Christian commitment to God and our neighbour. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of both fast and abstinence in which the law of fasting binds those who have completed their 18th year, until they have reached their 60th year; the law of abstinence (from meat) binds those who have completed their 14th year.

Catholics are also obliged to receive Holy Communion at least once a year between Ash Wednesday and Trinity Sunday. We are also obliged to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Penance) within this same period. During Lent you will note that the 'Alleluia' and 'Gloria' are omitted at Mass, even in celebration of solemnities and feasts.

Please note that ashes will be distributed during both the 9.00am and 7.30pm Masses to be held at Blackheath on Ash Wednesday.

PANCAKE SUNDAY: As stated in last week's Bulletin, and as is our normal practice, we have brought forward to today Shrove Tuesday's celebration of pancakes!!! These will be available after Mass during our social get-together at a cost of only \$1.00 per pancake. Syrups and sugar will also be on hand FOC (free-of-charge).

PROJECT COMPASSION:

All funds from today's pancake sale and other activities undertaken during this Lenten-Easter period will be forwarded to Caritas once Easter concludes. While on that subject, the Caritas empty coin boxes are available for your collection today to take home, to fill with spare change and return to us by Easter Sunday.

SHROVE TUESDAY: As is normal practice for Shrove Tuesday, all Parramatta Diocesan priests, including me, will gather at St. Patrick's Cathedral for a special Mass and meal as a precursor to Lent's arrival. Unfortunately, on this occasion, I expect to return too late to celebrate our 6.30pm Mass. Please note that there will be NO Shrove Tuesday 6.30pm Mass this year!

LENTEN GROUPS: While interest in forming one of these groups is still at an all-time low, we have taken the liberty of purchasing a few self-explanatory Lenten booklets titled "Compassion." These contain daily reflections for this year's Lenten Period. They are available from the brochure stand without cost – one copy per family! There are no reserve stocks!

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER: This being Wednesday evening, our hosting of this year's World Day of Prayer is still two days away. Obviously, a verbal report on the conduct of this worldwide ecumenical event will be rendered to you after today's Mass. However, even before this event takes place, congratulations are in order for our co-ordinator Diane Stewart and her 'team' who, at no notice whatever, have managed to make this a remarkable occasion in my opinion.

Plenary 2020 Update: Thanks to all who attended our Parish Forums and last Sunday's Public Forum at Lawson. Thanks especially to all who helped out as group leaders, cups of tea and prayer. We could not have contributed to the Plenary 2020 consultations without you. So far there have been 10,000 submissions from 75,000 people (some were group submissions). Our input has not ended vet. Stage two of the process, **Discernment**, will involve small groups in Parishes working through the National Themes that arise from the submissions received and feeding back our responses that will then be collated and presented as papers for the Council delegates to deliberate on. Stage two will begin in a few months. Bishop Vincent has said that our diocese will start before 2020 to look at themes emerging from submissions from our diocese and see what could be implemented at the diocesan level. At our last Parish forum, there was a strong recommendation that we look at implementing at a Parish level, some of the ideas that have come forward
