AETARE SUNDAY: Today, the fourth Sunday of Lent, is one of the two occasions in the Church year when the priest is entitled to wear pink (or should I say 'rose-coloured') vestments. This is an optional choice, which is just as well considering that I do not possess any vestments of that colour. The word "Laetare" is taken from the first word of today's Entrance Antiphon whose translation from the original Latin means "Rejoice with Jerusalem!" By way of general interest, the other Sunday authorised for the wearing of pink vestments occurs on the Third Sunday of Advent. From this Sunday forward, our attention will particularly focus on Jesus' Passion, Crucifixion, Death and Resurrection.

SACRAMENTAL PROGRAMME FOR 2019: I confirm last week's Bulletin commitment to send introductory letters to the parents of all children taught by our catechists at the three local public schools. The letter invites those eligible children to be nominated by their parents for participation in this year's Sacramental list. We should have an idea of the numbers involved by the end of next week. We will instruct this year's group towards receipt of the four Sacraments of Initiation (or part thereof, as necessary) – Baptism, Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation during the next six months.
