

Once each year, in particular, we take time out to honour our Mums. This is that day! The strength of all mothers is that they are complete givers of themselves and everything they have and are – both to their families and all with whom they share their lives. Mothers are the glue that holds families together! So, it's time for each of us to reflect on the importance of our mother in our life, to tell her so, and then do something exclusively for her as a great big 'THANK YOU' for looking after us so well!

BLESSING PRAYER FOR OUR MOTHERS (to be shared at the end of Mass):

"God of love, listen to our prayer. Bless the mothers of our families. Bless them with the strength of your Spirit. They who have taught their children how to stand and how to walk; they who have taught their children how to speak; how to sing and how to pray. Bless them today with sparkling health and other good 'things'. With joy, love, laughter and pride in their children, surround our Mums with many loving and caring family and friends."

GOOD SHEPHERD/VOCATIONS SUNDAY: The fourth Sunday of Easter (today), apart from this year also being Mothers' Day, is celebrated as Good Shepherd Sunday and the 56th World Day of Prayer for Vocations. The need for all vocations incorporating both religious and secular lifestyles is always an extremely high priority in our Catholic faith. While all vocations are valid and necessary, the Church forever has a great and particular need for more priests and religious. So we, God's faithful, on this day each year are encouraged to pray for more men and women to enter into consecrated life – a life of dedicated service to God, Church and people under the guidance of the Most Holy Spirit. Pope Francis has provided for us a comprehensive message on this subject, from which I quote below some excerpts for our consideration: "It is my great hope that all the baptized may experience the joy of belonging to the Church and rediscover that the Christian Vocation, just like every particular vocation, is born from within the People of God, and is a gift of Divine Mercy. The Church is the house of mercy, and it is the 'soil' where vocations take root, mature and bear fruit." The fourth Sunday of Easter also offers us the figure of the Good Shepherd who knows his sheep: he calls them, he feeds them and he guides them. So, in the words of Pope Francis we pray: "Father of Mercy, who gave your Son for our salvation and who strengthens us always with gifts of your Spirit, grant us Christian communities which are alive, fervent and joyous, which are fraternal life, and which nurture in the young the desire to consecrate themselves to you and to the work of evangelization. May Mary, mother and guide of Jesus, help each Christian community to be a source of true vocations for the service of the holy people of God."
