Do you ever glance at them, or do you just pass them by? The reason I am asking this question today has to do with the second half of May (Mary's month) (would you believe that May is half spent already - ouch!), in which we particularly honour Mary through two of her many important feasts. The first of these occurs towards the end of this coming week, Friday 24th May, the Feast of Our Lady Help of Christians – a Solemnity Feast for us in Australia. In her capacity as Help of Christians, Mary is one of our national patron saints. Therefore, it would be wonderful to have extra parishioners share in the 9.00am Mass next Friday morning to honour Mary as our help!

The second feast occurs the following Friday, the last day of May (31st May), when we celebrate the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary those 150 kms to her cousin Elizabeth who lived in 'Ain Karem' while in the early stages of pregnancy. That, too, is an important feast day for us to make an extra effort to attend the 9.00am Mass that morning. What a great way that would be to farewell Mary's month!
