VIGIL MASS TIMES, ST. PAUL'S MT. VICTORIA: Following discussions which have casually taken place this past month in relation to the 6.00pm Saturday Vigil Mass at Mt. Victoria, including a plebiscite of those present at one of the Masses, a decision has been taken to bring forward to 5.00pm (from 6.00pm) the starting time for the three June Masses to be celebrated at that church (1-15-29/6). In winter, and without daylight saving, darkness descends ever earlier with the result that most people are left feeling very uncomfortable from the dark and the cold come the end of Mass and their journey home (or wherever!). Hence this experiment via the three June Masses to see whether the earlier starting time improves the comfort of those attending the 5.00pm Mass. Whatever the progressive result, this 'test' will run its full course of the three June Vigil Masses, with a full review by those most affected to take place at the conclusion of Mass on 29th June. Should the change prove successful, then perhaps the new times could be made permanent until daylight saving once again intrudes at the beginning of October. So let's see what happens? You will note that the Mt. Victoria Mass time on the cover of this Bulletin has been adjusted to the new starting time of 5.00pm, also a special notice has been placed on our main Blackheath noticeboard, and suitable adjustments made to the main sign at Mt. Victoria only. In addition, a special notice is also separately on display at Mt. Vic.

JUNE & "THE MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS": Just as May is the month of Mary, June is the month of the "Most Sacred Heart of Jesus" whose actual feast this year occurs on Friday, 28th June when Mass will be celebrated at the normal time of 9.00am, followed by the rosary and exposition of the Most Blessed Sacrament. This is our Patronal Feast – a very important occasion for the parish. The whole experience should take about one hour. Because of the importance of this occasion to our parish, we will also be celebrating this special Solemnity Feast at the 9.30am Mass on Sunday, 30th June. I will repeat this message in the Bulletin the week before this great Feast!

Throughout this month we reflect on Jesus' Most Sacred Heart, on his limitless benevolence towards us and our complete devotion to God through his Son. In this, we need always to remember that our God is kinder than we are. We are not written-off by God when we fail him – as tax-gatherers and other unacceptable people were by the so-called religious elite of Jesus' time. 'Save yourself and us' one of the other crucified men said to Jesus who was in the same plight – and Jesus did! We also acknowledge that Jesus, our 'Good Shepherd', again and again gives of himself for his erring flock (us!), so that we feel secure in God because of our Saviour AND His Most Sacred Heart. Jesus' departure from us looked to be a terrible disaster, yet we now recognise it as our central religious event, along with his Resurrection! Our responsive love for Jesus is best expressed by us in the way we care for our more needy brothers and sisters as they journey through the pains of this life because, ultimately, we live/survive through Jesus' most loving, most saving, Most Sacred Heart!

CATHOLIC FOUNDATION: Next weekend we have an opportunity to financially support the education, formation and accommodation of the young men preparing for the priesthood at the Good Shepherd Seminary. So, please, give what you can! Envelopes will be found in the pews at that time for your convenience.
