I refer of course to the infinite love that binds each person of the Trinity - Father, Son and Most Holy Spirit – so indivisibly and intimately close to one another as to be inseparable as our GOD!

Our readings today indirectly give us an insight into the magnificent way the three persons that make up the Most Divine Trinity interact with each other. WE have much to learn about our life, the way we live it, and our dependence on God and one another with a faith that totally unites us. The Triune God is all about unity – and the example that God's unity sets for us to follow. Every time we make the sign of the Cross, we reinforce our unity with God – and our survival need to have a similar unity with each other! **ANNUAL CONFESSIONAL OBLIGATION:** Just a final reminder that the obligation for you to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation MUST be fulfilled between Ash Wednesday and Trinity Sunday (today!). Failure to abide by that obligation carries with it the taint of serious sin (mortal sin!). Should you not receive this sacrament within the above time-frame, I fervently suggest that you do so at your earliest opportunity.

COMMISSIONING OF CATECHISTS: During today's Mass, after the homily, our Special Religious Educators (Catechists) will be commissioned to carry out their indispensable teaching for this year (2019) in which you also are invited to support them after their commissioning in this valuable work by joining in the following liturgy:

<u>Celebrant (to non-catechists):</u> My brothers and sisters, realizing that we all share in this ministry of Special Religious Education, do you pledge your support for these parishioners of ours chosen by God from out of our midst and commissioned by us as SRE's in our parish religious education programme?

- Community: We do!
- Celebrant: Will you endeavour through prayer and witness to be ministers of God's Word to each other, so that we may grow together in sharing in this work of the Lord?

Community: We will!

Celebrant: Let us continue with our liturgy, seeking our Father's blessing on this work which we undertake.

Community: Amen.




