We also celebrated this Feast on its proper day, last Friday (28th June), that being the 17th day after Pentecost Sunday, which confirms for us that this Feast Day of the Most Sacred Heart is a variable feast dependant on the fall of Easter Sunday that is itself dependant on the moon cycle for any particular year.
