As for me, I am well rested and rearing to go! Finally on this subject, I would be greatly remiss if I didn't abundantly thank Fr. Robert Anderson for his voluntary stoic mid-winter stint with you. And I thank each of you for looking after Fr. Robert so well during my absence. He must like you (and here), because he has already agreed to stand-in for me this time next year! How about that!
