**FATHER JOLLY'S REFLECTION** for the 13th Sunday in ordinary time.

"You may call God love, you may call God goodness, but the best name for God is compassion." The story of Jesus is a story of compassion says Meister Eckhart.

The good news of Jesus is that God is compassionate and there is no limit to God's compassion. His compassionate love and forgiveness are unlimited and unconditional and all-embracing. Hence the great call for the disciples of Jesus is to be compassionate in life. Compassion is an attitude of welcoming. The word "Compassion" comes from two Latin words, 'Cum and Patire', which means to suffer with. In other words compassion means to enter into the suffering of the other and to be with him/her in his/her suffering. It is to suffer with the other and to be kind and gentle to him/her in his/her pain. Compassion means to be one with the vulnerable. To be compassionate one has to be willing to renounce what seems to be selfish and self-oriented. Jesus tells us if anyone would be my follower, he or she should renounce anything that is selfish or self-centred, parents, children, family, then take up his cross and follow Him. Self-renouncing is a painful process. It means to be weak with the weak, to be powerless with the powerless and to be vulnerable with the vulnerable. It is entering into the painful situation and experience of the other and remaining with him/her in a sense of solidarity and oneness. It is to remain immersed in the conditions of fellow human beings in their brokenness. Let compassion be the name of God, reflected through each one of us. May we welcome God by welcoming others. "Anyone who welcomes you welcomes me; and those who welcome me welcome the one who sent me". (Matthew 10:40). "If anyone gives so much as a cup of cold water to one of these little ones because he is a disciple, then I tell you solemnly, he will most certainly not lose his reward". Jesus calls us to have compassionate love and service as our motto in life. It is always life-giving. It calls us to be sensitive to the suffering and feelings of others. Yes most of us desire and wish to be compassionate and life-giving but in reality, we tend to avoid it. It is our nature to avoid pain and suffering, and to enter into the pain of others is not our natural response. Only those who have experienced pain and have discovered by the power of faith and love, higher values beyond pain and suffering enter into the pain of others. The Cross of Jesus is the example of such higher value discovery. May we join our own crosses to the cross of Jesus. May we be able to take our own crosses and follow Him in our service to our fellow men and women. May Jesus grand us a compassionate heart to do so.

**PARISH COUNCIL:** Since the Parish AGM last October, the council has been working with the Pastoral Planning Office of the diocese in supporting our parish process of discernment for the future. Now that the new members to the council have settled in, they are continuing to walk with us as we put in place a Parish Plan for the remainder of this year and next - 2020 and 2021. The areas we are focusing on for our Parish Plan are drawn from the Plenary Council 2020 consultations that have taken place in our parish, in our deanery, in our diocese and right across Australia.

The council is currently involved in looking at what you have said and what is said in the papers that have been developed from these submissions. (plenarycouncil2020.org.au/discernment/discernment papers).

We will select key areas and develop goals and a plan of action for you to reflect upon and give us your feedback in the coming weeks. With the Covid-19 restrictions still in place, it has been a time to steadily progress the council's work. We hope that with restrictions easing, there will be opportunities to engage more easily with everyone about the Parish Plan. For the moment, however, we are relying mainly on email and phone contact to keep you informed and involved. It has been rewarding to witness the generosity of those who have stepped forward to keep things moving in these extraordinary times. Thank you all.
