## DISCERNMENT PAPERS HELP SHARPEN FOCUS FOR PLENARY COUNCIL

Six Discernment and Writing Groups, one each for the six national themes for discernment that emerged from the Council's Listening and Dialogue phase, were tasked with writing papers to bring some major themes and issues into focus.

"The papers are the fruits of communal discernment. The aim of the discernment process was to draw upon the lived faith and experiences of more than 220,000 Australians, the living tradition of the Church, sacred Scripture, papal teachings and additional insights from outside the Church," said Archbishop Costelloe, the Plenary Council president.

### FATHER JOLLY'S REFLECTION FOR THE HOLY TRINITY SUNDAY.

The God we believe in is a community of three persons, The Father, The Son and The Holy Spirit. And the indivisible oneness of the three Divine Persons stems from the eternal process of self-gifting to each other. A community becomes possible only through the process of a self-gift. The very process of self-gifting is nothing else but self-giving and communication. The better, the self-giving and sharing, the more personal and more intimate it is, the deeper and more intimate becomes the communion of the community. Today we celebrate the Trinity Sunday. It is natural for us to ask the question what earthly use has the doctrine of the Blessed Trinity for today's men and women? We believe Trinity is still a mystery. Christianity proclaims primacy of the persons and presents the Blessed Trinity – three persons in a perfect love relationship. It is in this context Trinity becomes the model of personal relationships. The three persons of the Trinity know and love themselves perfectly and relate perfectly to the others. It is mutual knowing, loving, sharing and giving based on knowledge, love and self-donation. This is the basis of the Trinitarian Community/ Unity in love.

Each one of us are called to imitate the example of the Holy Trinity. Healthy, harmonious relationships are hard to come by. A host of personal, interpersonal and social problems heavily militate against healthy relationships. We fail to relate to others on a person to person basis. Our relationships are more functional than personal, parents vs children, teachers vs students, employers vs employees, superiors vs subjects. How seldom do we succeed in breaking the hard shell of the 'role-play' to encounter the person behind and to establish meaningful relationships?

By the nature of our being we are Trinitarian. Every human being is created in the image and likeness of the Holy Trinity. Thus we are called to form Trinitarian Communities. Each of us has a threefold love: Love of God, Love of Others and Love of Self. These are the first and second commandments: to love God above all and to love others as oneself. And this love has to be totally personal.

George A Maloney describes this Trinitarian love the following way. "The true test of how ultimately you are living in the presence of the indwelling Trinity is how intensely you strive to live intimately with each person who comes into your life. Hence, to change your love-relationships with other human beings, you are called to live in deeper focus upon the indwelling presence of God at the core of your being. As you touch God and receive His infinite, perfect love for you, you are transformed into a loving gift to others".

When we offer this loving self-gift to others, in this self-gift, we open ourselves to the healing trust of others. This way of self-gift keeps us in an unbroken growth-process of love. Our faith in The Holy Trinity tells us that we are gifts of God who is love.

As we celebrate the Trinity Sunday we pray: "Dear God of perfect love and our model of love, mould us to be a real gift of love to one another. Amen.
