Father Jolly's Reflection for the 18th Sunday in ordinary time.

Scott Peck, the author of *The Road Less Travelled*, describes love as an extension of oneself in the other, in order to nurture one's own life and that of the loved one, so that both may reach abundance of life. Many have friends, but very few develop all-round loving relationships that nurture lives. Loving involves nurturing and nurturing involves free and real communication, mutual understanding, acceptance, forgiving and challenging the loved one when necessary. In this extending of our own self to the loved one we help nurture our own life and that of the loved one. In today's First Reading Prophet Isaiah tells us how God nurtures us. "Thus says the Lord: oh, come to the water all you who are thirsty; though you have no money, come! Buy corn without money, and eat, and, at no cost, wine and milk" (Isaiah 55:1-3). God makes a covenant to nurture his people. God's covenant and commitment is to nurture and love. Again the Responsorial Psalm resounds the same love of God and his nurturing love. It says, "The hand of the Lord feeds us: he answers all our needs". Then it continues to say. "The Lord is kind and full of compassion, slow to anger, abounding in love". The Second Reading in today's Liturgy tells us that nothing can come between us and the love of Christ. One incident in the love of Mother Teresa makes it clear to us. Mother Teresa was giving the poorest of the poor and the most neglected sick not only food, clothing and shelter, but above all human love. Once she found a man half-eaten by maggots in a rubbish dump, who after being taken to Mother Teresa's home and looked after said: "Sister, I lived like an animal on the street, but now I am going to die with a smile and, like an angel, loved and cared for". Then he said "Sister, I am going to God's house". What can separate us from the love of God?". And he died very shortly after saying the above statement. What can separate us (you and me) from the love of God? Troubles, worries, persecution, lack of food, lack of clothing, trials, death, any power or height or depth, nor any created things, not even angels? Nothing can stop God from loving us. God will continue to nurture us. In today's Gospel we see the multiplication of the bread. Jesus multiplies the bread and feeds all the people. In order to do this nurturing he takes what the disciples had. He takes the five loaves and two fish. The same way the Lord asks us to give to him the five loaves and two fish we have, so that the Lord's hand can feed everyone and answer all our needs as well as the rest of the world. The Lord needs our five loaves and two fish. As the Lord continues to nurture us and feed us, may we allow the Lord to use freely the five loaves and two fish in our hands to become the nurturing bread and fish for the rest of the humanity. Let us give our five loaves and the two fish into the hands of the Lord. He knows how to multiply them and in his hand they are good for five thousand men, ten thousand women and twenty thousand children and even more.
