Fr John NAIDOC WEEK -TAKING ACTION: A recent National Church Life Survey record- ed that when individual churchgoers were asked what they themselves had done to en- courage indigenous reconciliation/awareness/ relationship building (see figure below) in the previous 12 months, almost six in 10 church attenders (59%) said that they had done nothing. Of those churchgoers who have acted on these issues, "Made an active effort to stay informed on indigenous issues and policies" was the largest action (16% of attend- ers). In a nation where Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples regularly ask for non-indigenous citizens to stand with them in policy and cultural issues only 4% of church attenders had engaged in public advocacy.
