Fifth Sunday in Lent Yr B 21 March 2021

The words of Jesus in today's Gospel must have been very important to a community that was awash with the blood of their fellow believers. Our foremothers and forefathers in the faith counted themselves blessed to die as Jesus died, alive in the faith of God's love for the world. Just imagine how that community of martyrs first heard these words, 'Unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit.

By comparison we have it easy today, but martyrdom comes to all believers in different ways. In the broadest sense a martyr is one who is prepared to pay the price for holding true to Christ. For us now this might mean making serious choices about the company we keep, the business ventures we enter into, the non-violent protests we mount, foregoing luxuries so that others in our world might have necessities, and even remaining faithful to the vows and promises we have made. Christian faith sometimes bites hard. and when it does we know we are sharing in the martyr's lot.

From Pastors Desk:

All three texts for today's Liturgy of the Word speak of a dying to the old ways in order to begin something new:

- * From an Old covenant to one now written in our hearts
- * Through His Obedience, Christ's death leads to new life and eternal salvation for us
- * Unless the grain of wheat dies, it cannot become something new...

As Christians we are continually asked by the Lord through the Scriptures and His Church to die to the old ways and begin a new way of living. Indeed, our Lenten Season is all about dying to sin and thus being prepared to experience a rising to a sinless existence in Christ.

And the best way that we can imitate the Lord in his Death and Rising again is to move from self-centred existence to a life lived for others. The Lord was someone whose whole existence was 'other-directed' - to the Father of us all and to His neighbours. Christ is the embodiment of the New Covenant written in our hearts; he is the one willing to be obedient to the Father's will and serve his friends - even unto Death!

As for us: let's ponder on the Lord's words:

"If someone serves me, they must follow me; wherever I am, my servant will be there too"!

Notes for Parishes

1. Next Sunday is PALM SUNDAY, and the Commencement of HOLY WEEK. Please note the Mass and Celebration times in the Bulletin. There may be a few changes from past years.

We are having difficulty during these COVID times sourcing Palms; and, in any case, in order to be COVID safe, we cannot allow people to put their hands in a basket and take a palm. So, we are asking that you bring your own 'palm' for next Sunday - whether this is truly a palm branch (hard to find up here), or an inculturation of the Tradition by bringing a branch of a native plant. The people of Jerusalem cut branches native to their area... we can do the same in these unusual times.

2. CONFESSION TIMES are in the Bulletin. There is a Second Rite of Reconciliation at Blackheath on Tuesday evening. First Rite Confessions in the Upper Blue Mountains Parish are as normal, with the addition of Confession after weekday masses on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of Holy Week.

Please Note: although there will be Confessions after the Way of the Cross on Good Friday at Katoomba, this is by way of EXCEPTION. The Church encourages EVERYONE to make their Confession before the Easter Triduum commences - that is, before the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday evening.

This is so that we are all prepared for these important days beforehand; and the Church wishes the Church's Ministers (the priests) to have the time and space to pray and reflect during this most holy of days.


