

Jesus chose disciples to continue his work; he instructed them and empowered them. He sent them out on a mission, and they returned. People followed them, because they wanted to hear what Jesus and the disciples had to say; they wanted to be released from the sickness and the demons that possessed them.

There are so many searching people in the world today, people hungering for instruction, good people looking for direction. They may be parents who are sick with grief over the future of a troubled child; a man stripped of his dignity through unemployment; a woman facing a pregnancy alone; elderly people feeling the surge of life leave their declining bodies; people who are angry and confused because they believe that the church is no longer dependable. They are people who are looking for answers and for meaning. They are like sheep without a shepherd, and Jesus looks to us to shepherd them.

In the midst of this confusion, there are reliable shepherds who walk with us in the dark valleys. They are willing to share the dangers through which we pass, even at the risk of their own safety. They do not pit one segment of the community or one theological perspective against another, scattering the sheep and driving them away. Instead, they work to dismantle the walls that divide us. They speak the word that gathers us together. They reconcile us with God and with each other. They may not give us easy answers, but their primary concern is to lead us to Jesus, the one who is our peace.

Reflection

Dear Brothers and Sisters!

In today's gospel from Mark we see an example of the alternating periods in the life and ministry of the Lord and the Apostles.

After a heavy time of ministering to the people, there is need for rest, a recharging of the batteries! And so they head off for a bit of a 'retreat'.

But the people guess where they're going, and arrive before them. Rather than heading elsewhere, Jesus decides that, as sheep without a shepherd, they're still in need of Teaching and Healing.

These words speak to us today because they encapsulate the realities of our Christian life... the alternating need that each and every one of us have between times of rest and times of action.

Without rest we cannot continue to work and minister to those in need; but without work and ministry our resting can become self-indulgence!

As the weeks of our lockdown seem to be increasing, we must guard against a slackening off in our ministry to others. Yes, we cannot come to church or help those at home, but we can call them up, we can pray for those struggling at this time.

Similarly, this period is an opportunity for a kind of 'retreat', a period of prayer and reflection that re-ignites the flame of faith and love with the Father.

As our week unfolds, let's embrace the opportunity to spend some more time with the Lord in prayer; but let us also give a little of our time to others through a phone call or a zoom conversation, checking up that all are travelling ok.

One biblical scholar summarised this so well: William Barclay writes: "We must never seek the fellowship of God to avoid the fellowship of people, but to fit ourselves better for it. The rhythm of the Christian life is the alternative meeting with God in the secret place and serving people in the market place".

My thanks to the Team that are providing an ever-increasing 'professional' live-streaming mass from St Canice's on Sundays at 10am. Hopefully it will not be too long before we can gather together in our church communities in person!
