FR. JOHN'S REFLECTION.

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

Today's Gospel is a challenge to all of us, for it demands that we imitate the Lord in his suffering rather than in his glory!

The brothers, James and John, wanted to lord it over the other disciples - to sit at the right and left hand of the Lord in his Glory.

And they end up being called to imitate the Lord in his Suffering: "Can you drink the cup which I must drink?"

How, then, do we treat others?

Do we fail to be of service and prefer to 'lord it over' others we may deem to be 'below us' in some kind of hierarchical structure?

Such 'clericalist' thinking is not Christian; and I note that such thinking is not restricted to the ordained among us!!

Rather, the Gospel of Jesus of Nazareth calls us to imitate the Suffering Servant (Christ) and be the servant of all.

If we do this to the best of our ability, then we will be true disciples of the Lord who 'did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many".

Our churches will reopen for prayer once the State of NSW has reached the 80% double vaccination target.

Masses will resume on the Sunday after that!

Given the unknown date of reopening at the time of the printing of this bulletin, I cannot be certain that we will have masses before the Sunday after 80%.

Mr Perrottet has caused some confusion, I believe....

Please note the message in the bulletin about the way we will be receiving communion for the foreseeable future once masses recommence.

During these long days of lockdown, the Parish really needs your support to allow us to continue to pay its ongoing bills. With the closure of all churches, we currently have no cash collections. Fortunately many of our parishioners use the Direct Bank Transfer option for our 2nd Collection. The funds raised continue to support our Parish during these difficult times.

Receiving Communion.

Given the very infectious nature of the Delta variant, Fr Abraham and I have decided that will we not be giving communion on the tongue for the foreseeable future once masses resume.

This will avoid the possibility of aerosol droplets remaining on our hands as we take another host from the ciborium and give to the next communicant.

In addition, those receiving communion on the hand will need to keep their mask on until they have received the host from the minister, then take a few steps to one side, remove their mask, and then consume the host.

Again, this will lessen the danger of any COVID-19 transfer.



**When we set out to follow Jesus, faithful to the promises that we made at baptism to renounce sin and live lives directed by the Spirit, we normally do so with generosity of heart. However, after we have borne the burdens of this decision and realise some of the implications of our commitment, we



begin to wonder if it was worth it. We believe that God will generously bless us. Still, would it be so wrong to hope for a little more, especially if we have made significant sacrifices along the way?

Of those to whom much has been given, much will be required in return. The closer we are to Jesus, the more we will be expected to mirror him. The great ones in the reign of God, the ones who exercise authority over others, must be the servants of the rest. Parents, teachers, civil authorities, managers of every kind, pastoral leaders must all be servants, as Jesus was a servant. We will also have to drink from his cup of suffering and be baptised into his death. As we draw close to the one who gave his life as an offering for sin, we will find that the same selfsacrifice is being asked of us. When we struggle with the misfortunes that we face because of our commitment to Jesus, we will have him as an inspiration and a model to follow. He can sympathise with our weaknesses, identify with our suffering. We can draw strength from his example and hope from his kindness.

THE GOSPEL Mark 10:35-45

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, approached Jesus. 'Master,' they said to him 'we want you to do us a favour.' He said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?' They said to him, 'Allow us to sit one at your right hand and the other at your left in your glory.' 'You do not know what you are asking' Jesus said to them. 'Can you drink the cup that I must drink, or be baptised with the baptism with which I must be baptised?' They replied, 'We can.' Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I must drink you shall drink, and with the baptism with which I must be baptised you shall be baptised, but as for seats at my right hand or my left, these are not mine to grant; they belong to those to whom they have been allotted.'

When the other ten heard this they began to feel indignant with James and John, so Jesus called them to him and said to them, 'You know that among the pagans their so-called rulers lord it over them, and their great men make their authority felt. This is not to happen among you. No; anyone who wants to become great among you must be your servant, and anyone who wants to be first among you must be slave to all.
