Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

It is with great joy that we recommence face-to-face masses this weekend!

It has been very difficult over these past months, but our Faith and Prayer have sustained us. Now, we are more than ready to come together and celebrate our Liturgy in person!

Until 1st December there are some restrictions still in place for the unvaccinated among us: apart from personal prayer in the church and our masses, those who are not vaccinated may not attend meetings or visit the parish office.

Furthermore, those not vaccinated may not minister in our churches. Indeed, only those vaccinated may serve at the altar or take communion to the sick, even after 1st December. I realise this will impact some active parishioners, but we must protect the vulnerable.

When coming to mass, we need to use the QR code to sign in. If you don't have a smartphone, you will need to be signed in as a dependant by someone who has. Writing on a list is no longer the norm.

Furthermore, until 1st December, we must wear a mask in all church venues, as well as adhering to the 1 per 4 square metre rule. Please use the sanitisers provided upon entry.

With regard to the reception of Holy Communion: Communion will only be distributed on the hand. Please leave your mask on when receiving the host from the priest or minister, then take a few steps to one side, remove your mask and then receive the Lord. This process is now in place in order to reduce the possibility of the transfer of the highly contagious Delta Variant of the COVID-19 virus.

Congregational Singing is not permitted until after 1st December. Choir members must be fully vaccinated until this date.

These restrictions are difficult, but we need to think of our neighbour. As Pope Francis has consistently maintained, Christians need to do all we can to protect others, to protect the common good. Indeed, freedom is not an absolute! Our choices have consequences for us and for the community in which we live. Thus, let's do all we can to strive for the well-being of all!

Some other matters for Sacred Heart parish:

There is a PPC meeting on Sunday 25/10 from 11am via Zoom.

Weekday masses will now only be Wednesday at 6:30pm. Saturday morning mass at 9am will continue until when and if the new weekend mass timetable (as proposed below commences on the First Sunday of Advent. After that time, there will only be Saturday morning mass at Katoomba at 9am. First Friday will continue as before, as well as Third Friday afternoons at 4pm in St Joseph's Church, Megalong Valley

I would like some feedback on proposed changes to mass times... I do think we need a Vigil Mass in Katoomba. It is the largest church and many tourists would make use of a vigil mass at 5:30pm. Leura still needs two masses, so I would propose an 8:30am Sunday morning mass as well as the 5pm Sunday evening.

Monday mass will move to 12 midday from 1st November, allowing the school to have another option for attendance; and also to allow workers in the upper mountains to come to mass during their lunch hour.

My friends, I realise there is a lot changing - but these changes need to be introduced so that Fr Abraham and myself can better minister to you all in the six church communities of the Upper Mountains.

When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout and to say, 'Son of David, Jesus, have pity on me.' And many of them scolded him and told him to keep quiet, but he only shouted all the louder, 'Son of David, have pity on me.' Jesus stopped and said, 'Call him here.' So they called the blind man. 'Courage,' they said 'get up; he is calling you.' So throwing off his cloak, he jumped up and went to Jesus. Then Jesus spoke, 'What do you want me to do for you?' 'Rabbuni,' the blind man said to him 'Master, let me see again.' Jesus said to him, 'Go; your faith has saved you.' And immediately his sight returned and he followed him along the road
