Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

What is striking in all three texts from Scripture for the Fifth Sunday of Lent (C) is the admonition not to recall the past:

- * the sinfulness that led to Israel's destruction and exile
- * the past life lived as a slave to the Law of Moses and its strict interpretation
- * then past life lived as a slave to sin

Rather, the future is what we should concentrate on and in which we should place all our hopes:

- * for new ways of living in the wilderness of despair
- * for new life through the Resurrection experience
- * for new life through our liberation from sin

Forget the past; strive ahead for what is to come!

Our Christian life is one in which we journey towards the Lord and his gift of New Life, remembering the words of St Paul:

"I am racing for the finish, for the prize to which God calls us upwards to receive in Christ Jesus".

He shows that the mer- cy and compassion of God exceed the authority of the law. Once again we see that the readings of Lent are less con- cerned with mortification and penance than they are with divine graciousness and our response of joy and thanksgiv- ing. Paul is not satisfied with the blessings of the past. In fact, he considers them rubbish when compared with knowing and being united with Christ. Life with Christ transforms us from people who are caught in sin to women and men who have been forgiven. Life in Christ is the new thing that God has fashioned for us. First Reading

A reading from the prophet Isaiah (Is 43:16-21)

Thus says the Lord, who made a way through the sea, a path in the great waters; who put chariots and horse in the field and a powerful army, which lay there never to rise again, snuffed out, put out like a wick:

> No need to recall the past, no need to think about what was done before. See, I am doing a new deed, even now it comes to light; can you not see it? Yes, I am making a road in the wilderness, paths in the wilds.

The wild beasts will honour me, jackals and ostriches, because I am putting water in the wilderness (rivers in the wild) to give my chosen people drink. The people I have formed for myself will sing my praises.

The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy.

Second Reading

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Philippians (Is 43:16-21)

I believe nothing can happen that will outweigh the supreme advantage of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For him I have accepted the loss of everything, and I look on everything as so much rubbish if only I can have Christ and be given a place in him. I am no longer trying for perfection by my own efforts, the perfection that comes from the Law, but I want only the perfection that comes through faith in Christ, and is from God and based on faith. All I want is to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and to share his sufferings by reproducing the pattern of his death. That is the way I can hope to take my place in the resurrection of the dead. Not that I have become perfect yet: I have not yet won, but I am still running, trying to capture the prize for which Christ Jesus captured me. I can assure you my brothers and sisters, I am far from thinking that I have already won. All I can say is that I forget the past and I strain ahead for what is still to come; I am racing for the finish, for the prize to which God calls us upwards to receive in Christ Jesus.

<u>Gospel</u>

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John (Jn 8:1-11)

Jesus went to the Mount of Olives. At daybreak he appeared in the Temple again; and as all the people came to him, he sat down and began to teach them.

The scribes and Pharisees brought a woman along who had been caught committing adultery; and making her stand there in full view of everybody, they said to Jesus, 'Master, this woman was caught in the very act of committing adultery, and Moses has ordered us in the Law to condemn women like this to death by stoning. What have you to say?' They asked him this as a test, looking for something to use against him. But Jesus bent down and started writing on the ground with his finger. As they persisted with their question, he looked up and said, 'If there is one of you who has not sinned, let that one be the first to throw a stone at her.' Then he bent down and wrote on the ground again. When they heard this they went away one by one, beginning with the eldest, until Jesus was left alone with the woman, who remained standing there. He looked up and said, 'Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?' 'No one, sir,' she replied. 'Neither do I condemn you,' said Jesus 'go away, and don't sin any more.'
