First Sunday of Lent Year C.

6 March 2022.

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

he three Temptations that Jesus experienced occur in our lives under various guises.

There are times when we give in to the rampant individualism and materialism of contemporary living. Affluence can blind us to spiritual realities! Self-indulgence often leads us toward a myopic selfishness, inimical to Gospel values. The words of Jesus echo in our minds: "One does not live on bread alone!"

At other times in our lives we can give in to temptation: we can have that extra drink that puts us over the limit; we can engage in reckless driving, screeching the tyres in rage at other drivers whom we perceive as having 'cut us off'. In these and other actions we can bask in the compliments of peers to the detriment of Christian values; we can deny Jesus and the Gospel Truth in subtle and not-so-subtle ways to avoid ridicule; and we can neglect our basic relationship with God in prayer in order to have more time in front of the TV! In all of this the words of Jesus echo in our hearts: "You must worship the Lord your God, and serve Him alone!"

And then again, there are times of doubt and despair, when we are tempted to throw in the towel at the slightest criticism of our values; when we question God's goodness - indeed, the Lord's very existence; when we make bargains with God... There are times when we try to put God in the subordinate position with ourselves as the controlling authority in our lives. It is then that the words of Jesus echo in our minds and hearts: "You must not put the Lord your God to the test!"

Lent is a time when we are encouraged to reflect on our need for God; when we are asked to practice the three traditional actions of Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving; when we are advised to celebrate the healing gift of God to us called the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

My friends, let's open ourselves up to God's Spirit of Truth, so that we can work with the Lord in this Lenten Season in the hope of coming to greater knowledge and understanding of His Will for us; and...so that we may be able to resist the Temptations that come our way in life in order to be able to stand victorious with Jesus on the Day of Resurrection!

**Lent is a time when we are reminded that there is nothing we can do to win our salvation. It is a pure gift from God. Like Jesus in the wilderness, we are to allow God's plan to unfold in and through us. Lent is a time for us to enter actively into the mysteries of the death and resurrection of Jesus, and there to marvel at what God has done for us.



The temptations of Jesus are the same temptations that we face when we are inclined to think that somehow we are in control. While the goals of the temptations may be admirable – feed the hungry, bring the world under the control of good, trust in God's power to protect us – we often choose to accomplish them in ways that are less than admirable. We try to perform the extraordinary so that what we do reflects favourably on us. We use brute force in order to achieve control. We put God to the test rather than live peacefully with God's plan as it unfolds within and around us. We seek to become the super-hero, the super-minister, the super-Christian on our own. In his responses to the tempter, we see Jesus constantly deferring to the power of God: It is not by bread alone . . . worship only God . . . do not put God to the test. In a real sense, these temptations are a reminder that the fundamental temptation is to deny our human limitations and refuse to let God be God for us.

First Reading

A reading from the book of Deuteronomy (Dt 26:4-10)

Moses said to the people: 'The priest shall take the pannier from your hand and lay it before the altar of the Lord your God. Then, in the sight of the Lord your God, you must make this pronouncement:

"My father was a wandering Aramaean. He went down into Egypt to find refuge there, few in numbers; but there he became a nation, great, mighty, and strong. The Egyptians ill-treated us, they gave us no peace and inflicted harsh slavery on us. But we called on the Lord, the God of our fathers. The Lord heard our voice and saw our misery, our toil and our oppression; and the Lord brought us out of Egypt with mighty hand and outstretched arm, with great terror, and with signs and wonders. He brought us here and gave us this land, a land where milk and honey flow. Here then I bring the first-fruits of the produce of the soil that you, Lord, have given me." You must then lay them before the Lord your God, and bow down in the sight of the Lord your God.'

<u>RESPONSE</u> Be with me, Lord, when I am in trouble

Second Reading

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans (Rom 10:8-13)

Scripture says: The word, that is the faith we proclaim, is very near to you, it is on your lips and in your heart. If your lips confess that Jesus is Lord and if you believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, then you will be saved. By believing from the heart you are made righteous; by confessing with your lips you are saved. When scripture says: those who believe in him will have no cause for shame, it makes no distinction between Jew and Greek: all belong to the same Lord who is rich enough, however many ask for his help, for everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.

ACCLAMATION

Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, king of endless glory! No one lives on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, king of endless glory!

<u>Gospel</u>

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke (Lk 4:1 -13)

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit through the wilderness, being tempted there by the devil for forty days. During that time he ate nothing and at the end he was hungry. Then the devil said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to turn into a loaf.' But Jesus replied, 'Scripture says: Man does not live on bread alone.'

Then leading him to a height, the devil showed him in a moment of time all the kingdoms of the world and said to him, 'I will give you all this power and the glory of these kingdoms, for it has been committed to me and I give it to anyone I choose. Worship me, then, and it shall all be yours.' But Jesus answered him, 'Scripture says:

You must worship the Lord your God, and serve him alone.'

Then he led him to Jerusalem and made him stand on the parapet of the Temple. 'If you are the Son of God', he said to him 'throw yourself down from here, for scripture says:

He will put his angels in charge of you to guard you,

and again:

They will hold you up on their hands in case you hurt your foot against a stone.'

But Jesus answered him, 'It has been said:

You must not put the Lord your God to the test.'

Having exhausted all these ways of tempting him, the devil left him, to return at the appointed time.
